These last three months have been filled with fear and uncertainty for so many in our community and church family. I encourage you to look to the Lord. On the next page you will find guidelines the Consistory has been working on for the resumption of our in person worship services on June 7th. We have looked at what other churches are doing, what our county health department is suggesting as well as state and federal information. If you have any questions, comments, or suggestions please contact myself or any member of the Consistory. I'm sure there is something we possibly overlooked, need to consider or need to include. For all of us this is unchartered territory. We all are trying to do our best. We need to practice patience, understanding, and respect as not all of us have the same views and opinions on how to proceed. If you feel uncomfortable being around large groups of people, are part of the more vulnerable population that has been affected the most, or are experiencing any flu like or cold symptoms, we encourage to stay home till you feel better. We will still provide live streaming of our services as well as DVD copies. Everyone is valued and respected during this time. If you would like a DVD copy of each week's service, please contact me.

Just a few highlights of the guidelines:

Worship service time is still 10:30 but there will be two locations, the Friendship Hall and the Sanctuary. Since the elevator will be closed, we encourage everyone who uses the elevator to attend the service in the Friendship Hall. We will be limited to 70-80 people per location. We encourage families with the last name of A-L to attend worship in the Sanctuary and those with the last name of M-Z to attend in the Friendship Hall. An exception of course are those needing to use the elevator since they are encouraged to attend in the Friendship Hall. We would like to ask families to rotate each Sunday where they worship so everyone gets to enjoy worship in the Sanctuary. Also please call the office to let us know if you plan to attend and how many plan to attend from your family. That will help us better plan seating in each location.

If we reach capacity in both locations, we will look to other options of worshipping in the Fellowship Hall or one of the classrooms. The worship service will be shorter in length. I'll dismiss the last rows first after worship is over. We have been purchasing additional bottles of hand sanitizer as well as Clorox wipes. There will be plenty on hand. Offering plates will be on stands in the back of each location for you to place your offering in.

I want to say a big thank you to Ronnie Kissick and Andy Burger for all of their hard work so we can stream services into the Friendship Hall. They have spent countless hours at the church making this possible. I also want to say thank you to the Consistory for all of their input towards these guidelines and leadership during these last three months. It has been difficult for sure but they have done their part to continue the work and ministry of the church.

I know everyone is excited to start worshipping in person again but I also know many are still a little concerned about all of this as well. I appreciate everyone's feelings and concerns as does the Consistory. I will send out a mass e-mail, post a video, and phone calls will be made to many in our congregation to answer any questions anyone might have. I'm looking forward to seeing each of you on June 7th.

In-Service Worship Guidelines until Further Notice decided by the Consistory on May 11, 2020 SUNDAY WORSHIP: 10:30 a.m. to <u>11:15 a.m.</u> WHERE: Sanctuary and Friendship Hall (gym)

Safe Distancing:

Preset safe distance seating for worship in both locations. Please refrain from clustering together in the common areas. Please refrain from hand shaking, hugs etc.

Sanitizer and wipes: Available throughout the church. Masks:

Encouraged and available, but not required. You are welcome to bring your own.

We encourage all to wear a mask when we sing.

Hearing Devices:

All hearing devices will need to be checked out to take home to ensure all are using the same one each week.

Please visit or contact the church office to check your device out before June 7th if needed.

Elevator:

The elevator will be <u>closed</u> during this time. If you are someone who needs to use an elevator, please join the worship service in the Friendship Hall.

Sanctuary worshippers:

Enter and Exit through the open front doors only. Doors will be left open during the worship service if the weather allows.

Please <u>sit only where bulletins have been placed</u> in the pews. 4 or more seating will be located on the Lectern side. 3 or less seating will be located on the Pulpit side.

Friendship Hall worshippers:

Friendship Hall will be a live stream of the service in the sanctuary. Enter and Exit through the open lobby/foyer doors only. Doors will be left open during the worship service if the weather allows.

Please sit only where chairs have been set. Your bulletin will be on the chair you select. <u>Please do not move the chairs</u>. If you do need to move a chair, please be sure it is a safe distance from other groups.

Offering: Please leave your offering in the baskets located at the back of the Sanctuary and Friendship Hall.

Children's Time:

Children will remain in their seats during Children's Time. Children's Bags: (removed to reduce touch points)

We encourage you to bring quiet activities for your child if they are unable to sit quietly.

Bathrooms:

We ask that you only use the public restrooms sparingly. Wipes will be available in the restrooms for your use.

Nursery Services:

The nursery <u>will not</u> be available at this time.

Bibles: (removed to reduce touch points)

We encourage you to bring your Bible or if you prefer, use a Bible app on your Cell Phone.

Hymnals: (removed to reduce touch points)

Please join the singing of the hymns printed in your bulletin. We encourage all attending to wear masks while singing.

Pew cards, pencils, and guest book: (removed to reduce touch points)

For the safety of all who are attending worship and our employees, you will notice that several areas of the church will be roped/taped/blocked off. This is to reduce the number of touch points. <u>Please do not cross those bar-ricaded areas, except for an emergency.</u> Your cooperation in this area is greatly appreciated.

CHURCH OFFICE AREA

Do not pass the barricades in the church office lobby without permission.

Do not enter the church office unless given permission.

- Please leave items needing to be dropped off in the receptacle available in the church office lobby.
- Hand Sanitizer and wipes are available. Please place used wipes in the trash can located in the church office lobby.

<u>Activities Scheduling</u>

Until further notice, the church will not schedule activities outside of worship. The consistory will review this monthly. Weddings and Funerals will be considered but will need special approval.

The UCC Consistory met for its regular monthly meeting on May 11, 2020 via ZOOM due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Pastor Cobb opened the meeting with prayer.

We reviewed and approved the regular reports: Treasurer's Report, Financial Secretary's Report, Stewardship Snapshot and Local Benevolence Report.

It was announced our next communion dates are May 31, Pentecost. Pre-packaged communion cups (juice and wafer) will be available in the downstairs lobby for members to pick up to partake together during the on-line services.

Reports and updates were given by several committees. Due to COVID-19 committee meetings and organization meetings are still cancelled through the month of June.

Pastor Cobb Pastor Cobb gave a verbal report. He is in the office and continues to keep in contact with folks. He continues to prepare and provide services on-line each week. These are going good and have been well received.

In ongoing projects and old business, status reports were given on finalizing the new church website, church roof replacement, and the handicap accessible door entry. New business discussed was scholarship and undesignated bequest CD renewals, continuing video streaming services and equipment needed, Senior recognition, and a detailed discussion and plan for reopening the church for in-person services on June 7 and beyond.


We rejoice with Shane and Kayla (Elliott) Baker on the birth of their daughter, Adley Ann. Adley was born April 15, 2020. Congratulations!


