Greetings in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ. Grace, mercy and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

We continue to monitor the latest guidelines from the state as well as from the federal government concerning the sizes of groups that can meet during this time. On Sunday the President extended these guidelines till April 30th. That makes it very unlikely we will meet in person for worship until early May. That is disappointing of course but I'm so thankful for the adjustments that have been made that have allowed both churches to still worship online together. These services are on the first page of the website, www.calmo-ucc.org. Just click on "Online Worship Services." The bulletin is even listed there, so you can follow and sing along. I've heard so many encouraging words from people that have been blessed by this. Thanks to Ronnie Kissick, Mary Beth Deeken, and Andy Burger for making this happen.

We have been able to make DVD copies of the services for those that can't view online. We distribute copies each week to all three nursing homes as well as a few individuals in town. If you would like a copy or know someone that would like a copy, please contact our office and we will get one to you. We can mail it, drop it off in your mailbox, or you can pick it up here at the office.

We want to make sure to stay in contact with everyone. Some have been using Facebook to check the well-being of our fellow members. I encourage you to contact each other by phone, text, Facebook, or other means. I'd love to hear from everyone via letter, text, call, or Facebook. I know we are missing the fellowship of believers right now so use every mode of communication to help us stay connected.

Some of you might not be part of our church group e-mail list. If you would like to be part of that group, please contact me or the office to get added to the list. I'm trying to communicate via Facebook and mass e-mail each week. I want to make sure everyone is getting the latest info. Also take advantage of Right Now Media and all of its resources for you and your family.

Since we will be unable to meet in person for Maundy Thursday and Easter Sunday, we are making arrangements for everyone to participate in communion. The church has purchased individual communion packets that contain juice and a wafer. We are going to make these packets available Wednesday April 8th from 3:00-7:00 in the parking lot for pick-up at the church. We can deliver them to you or you can choose to provide your own juice and wafer (cracker). We plan to include communion in those online services so we all can take communion together. We will be sure to handle those packets in the safest manner possible. Just contact the office, if you would like us to deliver these packets to you.

The Consistory and I want everyone to know we are praying for our church family and want to assist in any way possible. I've had various people ask how they can help. I have posted various opportunities to help in our community as I become aware of them. I feel the need will continue to grow this month. The church has the ability to assist our own church family in their times of need. Please make us aware of those needs. Together with God's help we will make it through this very difficult time.

I've been encouraged by everyone mailing in their offerings, dropping off their offerings, or setting up their online giving thru Easy Tithe. Thank you for your faithfulness in this area.

I want to conclude with this passage from Psalm 62:5-8:

United Church of Christ California March 9, 2020 – Consistory Meeting Highlights

The UCC Consistory met for its regular monthly meeting on March 9, 2020. Pastor Cobb opened the meeting with prayer.

We reviewed and approved the regular reports: Treasurer's Report, Financial Secretary's Report, Stewardship Snapshot and Local Benevolence Report.

It was announced our next communion dates are April 9, Maundy Thursday and April 12, Easter Sunrise (by intinction) and Easter regular service.

Reports and updates were given by several committees.

We reviewed activities of various organizations of our congregation. The Brotherhood program was presented by Rob and Lynne Branham from Australian Christian Mission. Vacation Bible School will be co-directed by JoAnn Cantriel and Judy Burger. Youth Fellowship hosted a pitch tournament with 20 teams. Isaac Ash and Trystan Hees were the tourney winners. Women's Guild hosted the World Day of Prayer March 6 with 50 attendees and 11 churches represented.

Pastor Cobb reported on the activities and duties he performed in the month of February: 4 worship services – California; 4 worship services - Salem; 1 Sunday School meeting; 8 home visits/communion; 27 days at office; 1 UCC of California consistory meeting; 2 group Communion (California Care Center & Moniteau Care); 4 recordings of Time of Hope; 4 high school basketball games attended; 3 office visits; 4 funerals/visitations (Dale Kuhn & Virginia Kirchhoff); 4 high school youth group meetings; 4 prayer cell meetings; 4 signing birthday cards with Kathy Grant; 1 Ministerial Alliance meeting/our month to handle community requests; 1 Martha Decker birthday party; 1 Evangelism Committee meeting; 1 Ash Wednesday service; 1 pitch tourney; 1 dinner with Burger's, Rohrbach's and Branham's; 1 Brotherhood meeting; 4 confirmation studies (Layne Brandes); 1 UCC Anti-Racism Training workshop in Jefferson City; 1 Friends of Music BBQ; 1lunch with Steven Burger about men's Bible study; 2 Tuesday night community Bible studies.

In ongoing projects and old business, status reports were given on e-giving, church roof issues, organist position and accompanist for the senior choir, new hearing devices, handicap accessible door entry, updating the website and the need for elevator operators. New business discussed was setting the date of April 29 for the last Wednesday night meal and May 10 for Senior Recognition Sunday, Easter breakfast plans, additional outside signage, LED light fixtures in the Fellowship Hall and possible contingency plans due to the coronavirus concerns.

Easter Envelope—Emmaus Homes

Emmaus Homes - Easter Sunday Mission Envelope

Emmaus Homes was founded in 1893 in Marthasville, Missouri, by our antecedent denomination (The Evangelical Synod) when they decided to use their vacated seminary buildings to serve individuals with developmental disabilities. As a reflection of their Christian faith, the founders of Emmaus attempted to care for those in need, while recognizing each person's worth and unique qualities and by creating a spirit of community. In 1901, Emmaus opened its St Charles campus to meet the vast need for services to people with developmental disabilities closer to St. Louis. Today, while some individuals still reside on the Emmaus campuses, many now live in homes in the community. Emmaus serves clients in nearly 50 homes throughout the St. Charles, St. Louis, Warren and Franklin counties and St. Louis City. Emmaus works with each client to help them live as independently as possible.

Arising from faith in Jesus Christ, the mission of Emmaus Homes is to enhance the quality of life for adults of all beliefs who have cognitive, intellectual, and other developmental disabilities. The individual's mental, physical, and social abilities are assessed to determine the living situation best suited to their needs, including on campus housing, group homes and individual supported living residences. Some homes have 24-hour supervision, while others provide part-time supervision and assistance.

At Emmaus, an individual's spiritual life is an important part of one's journey to fulfillment and independence. Emmaus takes pride in their faith-based heritage, and strives to help each of their clients participate in the faith community of their choice. Ordained ministers and seminary students help guide and encourage their clients of all beliefs in their spiritual pursuits. A variety of spiritual care services are provided to clients, family members, and staff.




