The California UCC Consistory met for its regular monthly meeting August 18, 2021, date delayed this month due to VBS. Pastor Cobb opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes of the July 2021 meeting, Treasurer's Report, Financial Secretary's Report, Stewardship Snapshot and Local Benevolence Report were reviewed and approved.

Reports and updates were given by committees and organizations. Evangelism participated in two parades, may need to announce/request additional participation on the floats. Committee is going to start planning future activities. Historical committee fixed lighting in display cabinet. Memorial-nothing to report. Building and Grounds is continuing to request quotes for stucco work and for concrete work. Issues with attic fan in the sanctuary, a new one needs to be installed, bids requested. Toilet fixed in Women's gym bathroom. Looking for a recirculation pump for hot water heater by dishwasher to ensure hot water during use. The chairs in Sunday School office need maintenance (screws missing, backs loose). Safe Church -condensate pump added to water heater to avoid trip hazard from hose in kitchen closet and a walk-through completed 8/18/2021. Worship- Committee reviewed previous quarter and has started planning next quarter. Wed night activities start 9/15/2021 (Youth Group, ROK, God Singers, confirmation). Cantata Sunday is scheduled for 12/19/2021. Planning special ideas during Advent. Confirmation: Becky Schneider will be coordinating with Pastor Russ and Linda Schnieders on events and planning. Stewardship- Packet for capital campaign project publication reviewed and approved. Announcements are forthcoming regarding a congregational meeting and details of the project. Brotherhood and Women's Guild continue with monthly meetings. Sunday school continues to plan picnic for Oct 10th. VBS was very successful. Rally Sunday is Aug 29th. Youth Group planning to participate in Night Light in High Point and planning youth Sunday for Sept 12th.

The films would prevent UV rays from fading/damaging materials inside as well as reflect heat. He is waiting on a formal quote and looking into additional quotes for comparison.

The Schnucks Endowment Checking balance was large in July 2020 due to a \$100,000 CD that matured. The amount was not reinvested that month due to the low interest rate environment. The \$100,000 is part of the original restricted gift and is unable to be expended.






