The California UCC Consistory met for its regular monthly meeting March 11, 2022. Pastor Cobb opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes of the March 2022 meeting, Treasurer's Report, Financial Secretary's Report, Stewardship Snapshot and Local Benevolence Report were reviewed and approved.

Reports and updates were given by committees and organizations. Evangelism, Memorial, Stewardship, and Schnuck Endowment have nothing to report. Worship Committee has a schedule made for the new banners to be placed in the sanctuary, year round. The group is well rounded with many different groups represented from our congregation. A straw pole will be done on May 8th regarding the passing of the offering plate. Consistory is requesting on behalf of the Worship Committee and our members that we make a concerted effort to keep the communion table clear of all items. Ushers will assist in ensuring items available on the back table for new members at the end of worship.

NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER

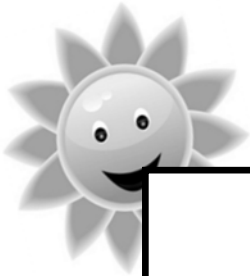
The California Ministerial Alliance invites you for prayer at the Moniteau County Courthouse on May 5th. Prayer will begin at 12:05 at the flag pole .

Russell Cobb. Pastor Russ opened the meeting with a prayer.

Carla read the March meeting, Cinda made a motion to accept the March meeting minutes, with correction to add Roberta Spieler and Cinda Scheidt as present. Roberta seconded. Motion carried. Cinda noted that our December check for Show Me Christian Youth Home has not been cashed, Rev. Cobb will call to check on the status of the outstanding check. Larry made a motion to accept the March treasurer's report as presented. Steven seconded the motion. Motion carried.

April local benevolence offering will be HALO House. For homeless children in Jefferson City, HALO represents far more than food and shelter. It represents the day their entire life changed. At the JC HALO Girls Home, our doors and hearts are open to pregnant, parenting, and non-parenting girls ages 16-21, and their children, who are in homeless or high-risk situations. Providing the foundation of a family means we not only give homeless kids a safe place to sleep. HALO holds the potential for a total reversal of fortune, because the homeless children and teens we work with don't just exceed expectations, they defy the odds.

Old Business:

Carole handed out a copy of the letter that will be sent out to new members inviting them to Sunday School. Additional items needed: a relocation of Sunday School (SS) opening, and location of classes, Carole will look on website to add information on what each SS class has to offer.

Camp Aurora - Carole is doing a great job in promoting church camp. Rev. Cobb asked if a flier should be mailed out to all our youth. After a discussion it was decided that Carole would add where to find camp registration forms.

Courtney said the Palms have been ordered and will be available Sunday morning. Easter breakfast will be paid by the church. Rally Day is set for Sunday, August 21 during Sunday School. We discussed not having classes or taking refreshment back to class. Due to The Story concluding on this date, no decision was made.

Teachers & Officers - continued

Summer Curriculum – Adult Class and Youth class will begin with Chapter 14 of The Story on June 5th. PreK-2nd grade will continue with the current curriculum. If anyone needs a copy of The Story let Judy or Laura Burger know, so it can be ordered.

New Business:

We discussed on where to promote SS class highlights; Rev. Cobb suggested either once a month/quarter during church announcements, or in the Tidings. No decision was made.

Ronda will be having another Veggie Tales about Queen Esther on Saturday, May 7. More information to follow. Several suggestions were given to Ronda on how to promote.

Pastor Russ gave some updates – Brotherhood is sponsoring a Family Night, Sunday, April 24 with pot-luck supper at 6:00 PM followed by entertainment by God's Singer and Bingo. All are welcome. Andy Burger and Ronda will be working on moving the Pastor pictures from main hallway to down the South hallway by the church offices. To make room for a banner. Lip Balm will be given out at Easter to all those attending church.

An anonymous donation of \$1500 was given for three SS classrooms; 1st/2nd grade, 3rd/4th grade and 8th grade rooms. These teachers can spend the funds making enhancements to their rooms. These teachers will bring in their receipts to Cinda who will be tracking this money separately on the monthly Treasurer report. If the \$500 for each classroom is not spent after a year, the remaining funds will be moved into the Sunday School account for usage. Steven made a motion to accept this donation with the stipulations made by the donor. Roberta seconded. Motion carried.

UCC Brotherhood Minutes – Monday, April 25, 2022

The Brotherhood met at 7:00 p.m., April 25th for a regular meeting.

Refreshments - The evening began with delicious food provided by Bob and Mary Ann Kueffer.

Program - Captain Justin Wendell from the Jefferson City Salvation Army presented the program.

He covered the various services they offer, with a 31 bed shelter being a major service. Normal stay in the shelter is 90 days, during which goals are established followed by progress toward the goal of independent living. He mentioned that a grant has been requested to modernize the shelter, including establishing 4 family units and making better use of current building space for social services and their monthly food pantry.

Other services include emergency cots for use during extreme weather and other extraordinary circumstances, an afterschool youth program, a summertime youth camping program, a program to help people needing rental assistance to prevent them from being homeless, a thrift store, etc.

When asked about how contributions are used, Captain Justin said 90 cents of every dollar given to them stays local. He also mentioned that for a number of years the Jefferson City Salvation Army was coordinated with the Columbia location. However, that will change soon and Jefferson City will be independent; a change that he believed would be positive.

When asked what happens when someone checks into their shelter, he said the first things were laundry and showering. Their traditional (perhaps unofficial) motto was Soup, Soap and Salvation.

Business Meeting - President Abe Rohrbach called the business meeting to order. The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read. Treasurer Tony Barry reported a balance of \$1463.17.

Comments were made of the success of the Brotherhood sponsored church family night the previous evening, with an estimated 135 or 140 people in attendance.

Steven Burger announced that the Parking Lot Ministry (clean up) would take place at 8:00 a.m. May 7th.

The request to fry fish for the last night of Vacation Bible School was agreed to, as was the request by the Worship Committee to provide special music in church on June 12th.

Men's Brotherhood—continued

Larry Rohrbach volunteered to provide refreshments at our next meeting on May 23rd. David Meyer volunteered to have the devotion at our September meeting and Steven Burger volunteered to have refreshments at our October meeting.

Devotion - Following adjournment, Abe Rohrbach shared a brief devotion followed by singing "How Firm a Foundation".
