"Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you." Matthew 28:19-20

What's the purpose of church and the Christian life? Is it to go to church every time the doors are open, read the bible cover to cover every year, and pray over every meal? Those all sound good and I wouldn't advise against any of those but there must be more. We get burdened down with so many activities and forget that Jesus wants a personal relationship with us like he had with his disciples. When we grow close to Jesus, we learn what is important to him and we start to follow what his commands are for the church. Matthew 28 is pretty clear. He wants us to make disciples that make a difference in this world but how does the church go about doing that?

This Sunday we will start to answer that question. First of all, we must have a goal and then a plan to accomplish that goal. Our mission statement at church is "To guide people of all backgrounds into a personal relationship with Jesus. We want to love God, love people, and make disciples for Jesus." We have developed a five-step process to help us accomplish that mission: Connect with God through regular worship, Grow our relationship with Jesus through reading, praying, giving, and using our talents, Love & Fellowship with others through our various small groups, Serve others through our various ministry opportunities, and finally Share the good news of Jesus with your friends and family. You are going to hear a lot about those six words the next several months: Connect, Grow, Love & Fellowship, Serve, and Share. Kind of a spiritual dashboard to let us know how we are doing spiritually.

During the nine months I worked with the search committee back in 2018 the dominant topic that was discussed was baptism, specifically infant baptism. I believe the New Testament teaches that baptism is the choice of the individual and that the biblical mode of baptism is immersion (or dunking as many here refer to it). I understood the history and tradition of infant baptism at both Salem and the UCC of California before I came. A policy was developed when I first started to handle infant baptism requests. I feel more comfortable performing baby dedications for infants. The Consistory updated that baptism policy last month and it is listed below. I have tried to approach this topic biblically and with respect. I have invited various individuals over the last four years to stop by my office and visit personally about baptism when they have questioned my view on baptism. That invitation is always open as is my door. Since we have had many new people join the church in the last couple of years, I wanted to make sure everyone was aware of this policy.

It's exciting to see school start as well as all of our Wednesday night activities. In addition to our meal, ROK, God Singers, Confirmation, and Choir practices, I hope to have a couple of bible studies for our adults. We are still working out the details but be watching for announcements in the future. I love the fall. May God bless all of us with opportunities to share his love with those we come in contact with each day.

November 2018

Upon the request of a Baptism or Baby Dedication:

The pastor will visit with the requestor(s) to get all pertinent information. If the request meets the church standards and the theology of the pastor, the pastor will perform the Baptism on the schedule decided upon with the requestor.

If the request meets the church standards but is outside the personal theology of the pastor, the pastor will contact the President of the Consistory who, in consultation with the requestor, will arrange a guest minister to perform the ceremony. The cost of the minister will be to the church.

California United Church of Christ August 9, 2022 – Consistory Meeting Highlights

The California UCC Consistory met for its regular monthly meeting August 9, 2022. Pastor Cobb opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes of the July 2022 meeting, Special Consistory Meeting on Aug 2, Congregational Meeting on Aug 8, Treasurer's Report, Financial Secretary's Report, Stewardship Snapshot and Local Benevolence Report were reviewed and approved.

Reports and updates were given by committees and organizations. Evangelism continues working on t-shirt designs and received one updated float banner, another is coming; they also represented CUCC in the fair parade this month. Worship Committee meets this week and will review the last quarter. Memorial, and Schnuck Endowment have nothing to report. Stewardship met in July and reported in the Tidings.

Building and Grounds updates:

Front doors have been installed and stained, handles corrected. Would like addition coat of stain applied.

AC unit for Friendship Hall was ordered (per congregational meeting) and will be installed upon arrival.

Andy reported boiler parts are ordered and work will be scheduled when received. Safe Church walk through completed: will order two new batteries/lights for back up when the power is out.

Down Spout in front of church was broken and clogged; Andy Burger is going to try to clear it.

New floor mats ordered to replace in the offices.

New rug ordered for entryway by offices.

Flower beds in front of church are overgrown, requesting quote on new landscaping.

Floor Tile Replacement: Awaiting moisture test. Will then need congregation approval for replacement.

Repairs at the back of Church-Walt Imhoff plans to start around Aug 15th this month.

Sanctuary AC's are done, bill has been submitted.

Boiler is ordered. When all parts arrive they will install.

Outdoor Painting and FixUps: Walt Imhoff plans to start around Aug 15th this month.

Storm Windows: South side Storm Windows, updated bid received \$35,017 (good for 30 days). (Bid includes: aluminum frames, painted white to match trim—also follows architectural design of the window, tempered glass, low E (helps with heat load/retaining heat)—will not be tinted. Will also need to pull off the Plexiglass, paint and re-glaze the windows.

Brotherhood and Women's Guild continue to meet with good discussions and studies. Sunday School continues with "The Story" this summer.

The R.O.K. (Reaching Our Kids) and God's Singers team is very excited to begin another season of our Wednesday night Kid's Program. This year R.O.K. is studying the book of Ephesians. Yes, that seems amazing for children 1st - 7th grade to be doing, but Phil and his friends (Emily the Elephant, Sam the Turtle, and a new friend Carlo the Hermit Crab) break it down into very small, understandable pieces. Each week we will learn a little more of what it means to live the way God intends - for us and for the whole world. Phil begins each video with the song lyrics, "Hey everyone I've got a couple reasons why to take a look at a book called Ephesians. Well there's a thing or two about God's plan. I know you're going to like it when you finally understand. So come on everybody let's read Ephesians now." Included in the short video are review questions on what we just learned. The second part of our R.O.K. time is craft time. If your child is in 1st-4th grade, they will make one craft a week. 5th - 7th graders will have fewer crafts to make, but each will require more than one week to finish. Craft time is a favorite time of those who have attended R.O.K. in the past. Following craft time, we immediately move to the sanctuary for GOD'S SINGERS to sing praises to the Lord and practice the song they will sing during Worship once a month. We bring all participants back down to the Friendship Hall (gym) for you to pick up at 7:20 p.m... Just so you are aware, many of the children love and look forward to shooting a couple of baskets before the designated person picks them up for the evening. We ask that you please arrive no later than 7:25.


