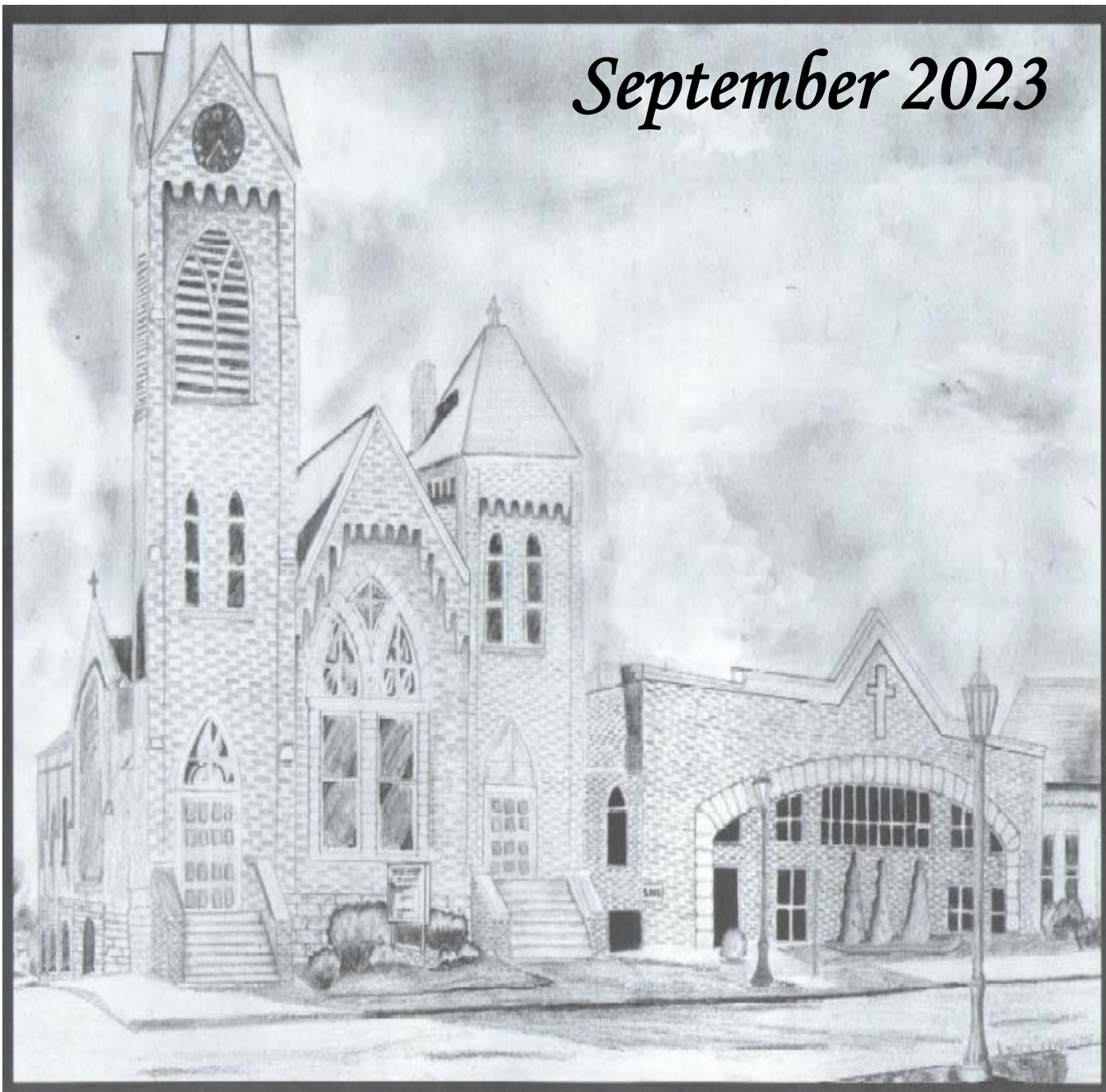

Bible Words – Hope

“By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.”

The Greek word for hope is “elpis.” Hope for the Christian is the confidence that what God has done for us in the past guarantees our participation in what God will do in the future. This is based on what God has done in Christ for us as well as the gift of the indwelling Holy Spirit. Given the assurance of hope, Christians live in the present with confidence and face the future with courage. Peter calls this a living hope because of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Worldly hope is based on a feeling and some uncertainty. I hope the Reds win the World Series and the Cowboys win the Super Bowl this year. I’m not very confident in that hope, but with Christian hope, we are sure of the future because of Jesus. Hebrews 6:19 says this about our hope in Jesus, “We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure.” Reaffirm your hope today in Jesus. Remember his promises about heaven and eternity to help you through each day.

In September, we start our regular Wednesday night activities like ROK (Reaching Our Kids), Confirmation, and our weekly fellowship meal. Also, we will have a five week class for married couples called “One Thing(s) for Married People.” It will start on Wednesday, September 20th and will be led by the Ingram and Bieri families. Historical Moment

How did we get started?

In 1848, German immigrants who had come to Moniteau County to find a new life got together and formed new congregations in the Salem community Southeast of California and in the Moniteau community North of California. Seventeen years later, as the area developed and California continued to grow and attract more immigrants from Germany, the pastors of the Salem and Moniteau congregations got together in 1865, and started the planning process for a German Evangelical Church in California. In May of 1866, a group of German citizens held a meeting at the home of H.C. Finke and decided to organize a congregation and erect a church building. Later that month, the new congregation met and selected a building committee and established a constitution and set of bylaws. On July 1, 1866, the church members voted to lay a foundation for a 30 x 50 foot church building. On July 8, Reverend F.A. Umbeck preached his first sermon in the old Baptist Church about a block east of our current building. On July 29, the cornerstone was laid in the new church building and our church history was well underway. F.A. Umbeck was our minister for the next 47 years – perhaps we'll hear more about him in upcoming historical moments!

August 14, 2023 – Consistory Meeting Highlights

The August meeting of the Consistory was called to order at 6:00 pm by President Laura Burger. Reverend Cobb opened the meeting with prayer.

A quorum was established with all members present--Ellen Ash, Carole Barbour, Jay Bestgen, Laura Burger, Alan Chambers, Ronnie Kissick, VanDee Miller, and Larry Schoeneberg.

The following business was transacted: Minutes of the July meeting and the Congregational Meeting on August 6, Treasurer's Report, Financial Secretary's Report, and the Stewardship Snapshot were approved.

There was a Facility use request from St. Paul's Day Care for use of the Friendship Hall gym on hot and rainy days. It was decided that they would be allowed gym use for one hour due to summer time heat.

Committee Reports

Building and Grounds/Safe Church (Jay Bestgen and Ronnie Kissick)

--Landscape Committee Update: Judy Burger continues to nurture the new plants until they can be planted. Ted Bueker will help with the weed cover and rock, and bubble irrigation. Lighting is a possibility as there is power but it does not appear to work. Ronnie Kissick will deal with these issues.

--Weathercraft Bell Tower project is scheduled for Fall. They will be asked to look at the rubber roofing over the elevator at that time.

--After the recent wind storm, some of the VBS workers noticed that the Church chimney cap had blown part way off. Jay Bestgen, Building and Grounds Co Chair, was contacted. Jay checked with Shane Baker, who works for the City to see if the City would help him out with their equipment to get the top off. City equipment was used to take it down. Mr. Baker located a chimney cap that would fit. He and Jay installed the new cap August 17, 2023. (Don't you enjoy a happy ending!)

--The tankless hot water heater in the Friendship Hall kitchen needed to have a T-connection replaced. It was repaired by the Tom Ward Company for \$350.00.

--It is time for the elevator to be inspected again. Rhonda is calling to schedule that appointment. (We all want trouble free rides.)

--Two of the air conditioners required service by H and D. On one of the units the compressor went out two months before the warranty expired. There will only be a labor charge for that one.

--There was damp carpet in the desk area of the Church office. After checking all possible sources, the reason remains a mystery.

--The contract for replacement cover of the Oak Street church windows was revised to include two north windows. The Brady quote is the same as presented to the Congregation. Probably the new coverings can be installed before the end of the year. It takes ten weeks for the frames to be made (in New York) and with the Congregation's approval of the project, the order can be placed.

--The magnificent stain glass windows on the Oak Street side need to have some repairs made. Two things will happen. First, there will be quality pictures taken of the windows for the archives. Then the repairs need to be prioritized. Brady Glass does this sort of repair, Jay Bestgen will meet with them to see how to proceed.

--There is a light out over the steps. It will be replaced.

--There was good positive response to the SWC proposal at the Congregational meeting. In response to a question Jay said that all doors would be re-keyed but there would be no other changes to internal doors. Jay will meet with SWC again after the Congregational meeting.

--Putting dimmable LED lighting in the Friendship Hall (gym) will require changing 12-17 switches. This includes replacing stage lighting with fanless bulbs that last 12,000 to 15,000 hours compared to the ones with fans that are good for 50,000 hours

--On Wednesday, August 16, 2023, when Bryan is here cleaning chairs, Jay will get a quote from him for cleaning all carpet on the lower level.

Evangelism (Alan Chambers)

--Fair parade went well. Evangelism is responsible for parade/float publicity. The Evangelism committee bought candy for the event and have been approved to spend up to \$150.00 per event. (Sweet!)

--It is time to think about updating the church directory. What would you think of a digital directory as a possibility???

Historical Committee (Norman Rohrbach)

--The display in the cabinet will be changed soon. Check it out--as well as the Historical Moments in the Tidings.

Stewardship (Larry Schoeneberg) Meeting scheduled 8/22/2023.

Worship (VanDee Miller)

--Thanks to all who shared their talents for a successful summer program.

Sound and Video (Ronnie Kissick)

--Meeting with Cindy Hall for training. (Is this something you could do? More help would be welcome!)

Pastor-Parish (Larry Schoeneberg)

--Attendance down a bit during summer as usual.

Pastor Report (Reverend Cobb)

--Baby Dedication for daughter of Austin and Kaitlyn Mouse on September 3, 2023.

--Begin Wednesday night programming with a series on marriage.

--Youth Sunday will be the Sunday after Labor Day

--The 2023-2024 Confirmands Class will have a student, parent, and pastor meeting on September 6, 2023.

--Within 2 years Pastor Russ requested we consider an additional minister with a focus on Family Life, Youth and Counseling.
