The Great Questions of Life

*“Meaningless! Meaningless! Says the Teacher. Utterly meaningless! Everything is meaningless.”
Ecclesiastes 1:2*

I might even buy you a bag of popcorn or a hotdog if I see you.

March 11, 2024 – Consistory Meeting Highlights

The March meeting of the California UCC Consistory was called to order at 6:02 pm by Consistory President Alan Chambers. Reverend Cobb opened the meeting with prayer.

A quorum was established with Ellen Ash, Carole Barbour, Jay Bestgen, Holly Bieri, Alan Chambers, Jim Deeken, VanDee Miller, and Larry Schoeneberg present.

Minutes of the February meeting, the Treasurer's Report, the Financial Secretary's Report, and the Stewardship Snapshot were approved. Reporting on CD activity, Financial Secretary, Larry Schoeneberg, said that in accordance with the Congregational vote a CD had been purchased through Edward Jones with \$46,000.00 from the Lebeck Bequest.

Worship statistics, with the exception of the bad weather Sunday in January, show that attendance is consistently between the 150's and 170's.

Building Use Requests were approved. On April 7, 2024, Cabinet meeting will be in the Fellowship Hall as there is a request for the Friendship Hall on that date.

Committee Reports

Building and Grounds/Safe Church - Jay Bestgen/Jim Deeken

*Oak and North Street Window Covers -Tentative start date of 3/25/2024 depending on the weather and the painting (Imhoff) and the repairs that need to be made (Brady) being completed.

*SWC (Security System)-Most of the wiring is completed--cameras in gym area and outdoor pedestal camera included. Time to start thinking of next phase which is programming and a meeting with SWC. This phase fits the program specifically to our Church needs and deals with everything from remote viewing to timing of doors.

*Elevator Valve/Head Space Signs -These items are still on the list. Of immediate concern is the leaking hydraulic pump which will be dealt with in house.

*Light Switches in Sound Room off gym-These are the original switches and some do not work, All will be replaced.

*Gas Stove Burner Knob Protection- A work in progress as nothing is commercially available. Something will need to be designed to meet the Church needs.

*Foyer Carpets - The corners are starting to curl and some areas do not lay flat if people drag their feet. Solutions to both issues will be pursued.

*The light in the attic has been changed.

*Communion holders on pews have been repaired.

*LED Lighting- As the ballasts go out there will be a switch to LED lighting.

*The Stewardship Committee met and discussed present and future needs with an eye on the needs list from Building and Grounds.

Worship- VanDee Miller

*Special music is going well for Lenten Services and plans are complete for Lenten services and Tenebrae.

*No need for purchases at this time.

Pastor Parish Relations - Larry Schoeneberg

*Allan Mortenson and Reverend Cobb meet every Monday and make a list of individuals to contact/visit. Currently they are the only team, but would like to expand that ministry.

California UCC Historical Highlight

Although most folks are probably aware of the roots and history of our Church, we thought it may be a good idea to provide a very short overview of the life and denominational changes of the Church for those who may not know.

It all started in May of 1866 when the German Evangelical Church of California was organized and the constitution and bylaws were established. The first Church service was held on July 8th of that year. A few years prior to the 75th anniversary of the Church, in 1935, the Church changed its name to the Evangelical and Reformed Church of California after conforming to decisions by the synods of both the Evangelical and the Reformed Churches. Years later, in 1957, we then became the California United Church of Christ due to the merger of the synods of the Evangelical and Reformed Church and the Congregational Christian Church. What's also very interesting, and kind of amazing when you think about it, is that in our 158 years of existence, we've had just 10 full-time senior pastors. It's also noteworthy that two of our earliest pastors were father and son.

Emmaus Homes - Easter Sunday Benevolence

Emmaus Homes was founded in 1893 in Marthasville, Missouri, by our antecedent denomination (The Evangelical Synod) when they decided to use their vacated seminary buildings to serve individuals with developmental disabilities. As a reflection of their Christian faith, the founders of Emmaus attempted to care for those in need, while recognizing each person's worth and unique qualities and by creating a spirit of community. In 1901, Emmaus opened its St Charles campus to meet the vast need for services to people with developmental disabilities closer to St. Louis. Today, while some individuals still reside on the Emmaus campuses, many now live in homes in the community. Emmaus serves clients in nearly 50 homes throughout the St. Charles, St. Louis, Warren and Franklin counties and St. Louis City. Emmaus works with each client to help them live as independently as possible.

Arising from faith in Jesus Christ, the mission of Emmaus Homes is to enhance the quality of life for adults of all beliefs who have cognitive, intellectual, and other developmental disabilities. The individual's mental, physical, and social abilities are assessed to determine the living situation best suited to their needs, including on campus housing, group homes and individual supported living residences. Some homes have 24-hour supervision, while others provide part-time supervision and assistance.

At Emmaus, an individual's spiritual life is an important part of one's journey to fulfillment and independence. Emmaus takes pride in their faith-based heritage, and strives to help each of their clients participate in the faith community of their choice. Ordained ministers and seminary students help guide and encourage their clients of all beliefs in their spiritual pursuits. A variety of spiritual care services are provided to clients, family members, and staff.

Cradle Roll Registry Policy
United Church of Christ – California
Effective March 2024

Cradle Roll is the department of Sunday School that ministers to expectant parent(s) and parent(s) of children from birth to two years of age who are not enrolled in Sunday School.

Requirements for a child(ren) to be added to Cradle Roll Registry:

Current children on Cradle Roll registry (2023) will be sent birthday card and received gift annually until two years of age.

Parent(s) must be an active member of the United Church of Christ – California per the active membership registry held by the Consistory.

Cradle Roll coordinator and/or Church Office may start the process:

Order flower to be placed on alter in church sanctuary,

Child(ren) name added to the bulletin the same week flower is placed on alter,

Child(ren) name added to the Cradle Roll registry held in church office.

If a Grandparent(s) of a non-active or occasional member of the United Church of Christ – California per the membership registry held by Consistory wants their grandchild(ren) to have a flower placed on the alter in church sanctuary.

Responsibility of the grandparent to purchase flower.

Child(ren) name added to the bulletin the same week flower is placed on alter.

Child(ren) will not be added to Cradle Roll registry.

Notification will be given by the church secretary.

Responsibility of Cradle Roll Coordinator:

Send birth announcement card to Parent(s) of child(ren),

Send 1st year birthday card to child(ren),

Send a 2nd year birthday card to child(ren), letting them know Ronda Mortenson teaches a 2-year-old Sunday School class they are welcome to attend.

Notice of current Cradle Roll children will be added in December Tiding

Present name of child(ren) and gift during Sunday School Christmas Eve program (12/24) to those child(ren) who have been added during the current year and those already on registry until two years of age,

If Child(ren) were not present for Christmas Eve program, the gift will be held in church office until January 31 of following year.

It is the responsibility of the parent(s) to pick up gift.

If the gift is not picked up by January 31, the gift will be reused for next year.

Responsibility of Pastor/Preacher:

Notification will be mailed out to Parent(s) of those child(ren) on Cradle Roll registry that a gift will be presented during Sunday School Christmas Eve Program (12/24) annually,

Include a statement, if not present on Christmas Eve the gift will be placed in the church office until January 31 of the following year. It will be the responsibility of Parent(s) to pick-up the gift.

UCC Brotherhood Minutes – March 25, 2024

Steven Burger volunteered to provide the devotion for the April 22 meeting and Alan Chambers volunteered to provide refreshments. The business meeting adjourned at 8:16 PM.

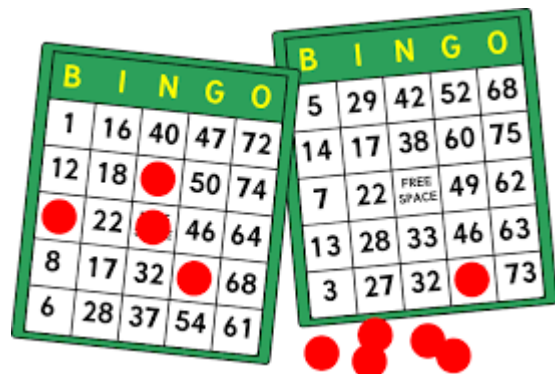

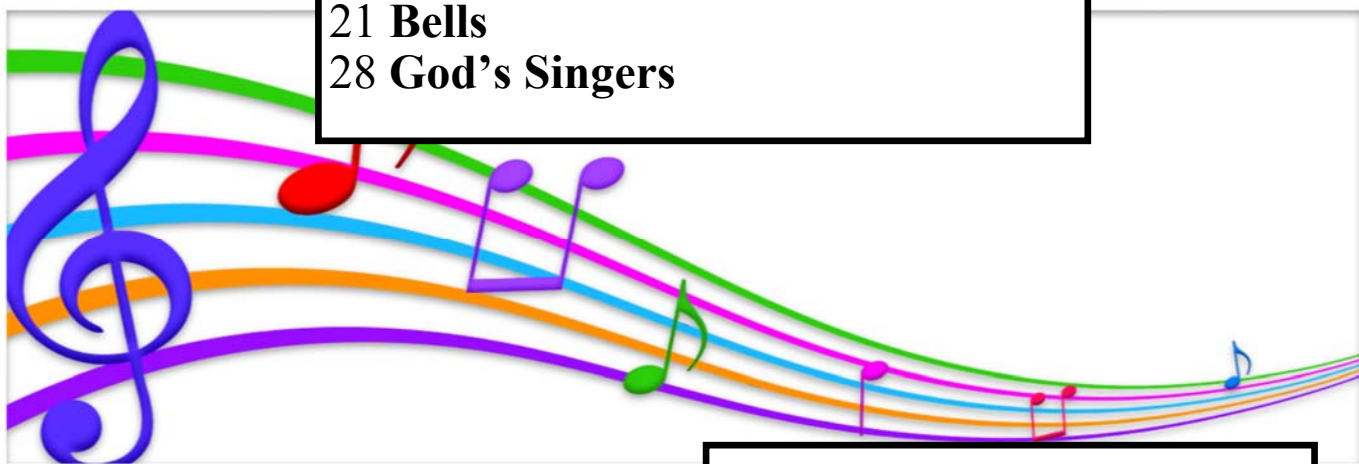
