

Also on October 18<sup>th</sup> will celebrate the confirmation of Layne Brandes. Typically this happens on Palm Sunday but the virus changed all of that of course. I'm looking forward to that special Sunday.

We continue to monitor conditions in the city, county, and our congregation concerning the virus. I feel our leadership is making our worship and safety their top priority. Please continue to pray for your leadership and put into practice the words of the Apostle Paul found in Colossians 3:14, 15:

### California United Church of Christ September 14, 2020 – Consistory Meeting Highlights

The California UCC Consistory met for its regular monthly meeting September 14, 2020. Pastor Cobb opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes of the last meeting, Treasurer's Report, Financial Secretary's Report, Stewardship Snapshot and Local Benevolence report were reviewed and approved.

Stacy Friedrich and Connie Bestgen were present to discuss resuming adult choir, bell choir and God's Singers. The adult choir will consist of small groups in September and October, with discussion and planning to possibly resume with full choir in November. Bell choir will also consist of a smaller group in those months. God's Singers will begin practices in October.

Reports and updates were given by several committees and organizations. The Safe Church committee did a walk-through of the facility and replaced batteries in Exit signs and inspected fire extinguishers. The Stewardship Committee met August 12 to review giving and attendance for the year and discuss the positive impact e-giving is having in 2020. They discussed anticipated needs for the future – possible A/C replacement, steeple work and Friendship Hall roof replacement. These will be further addressed as needs arise. The Building & Grounds committee reported the sanctuary roof project is complete. The slate on the steeple is in need of replacement. The committee is working with the insurance company to determine coverage. Sunday School held a VBS mini camp August 29. Youth Fellowship participated in Nightlight Labor Day weekend and in Youth Sunday September 13, with an excellent turnout and service. Senior High Youth Group will start on Wednesday, September 16.

We received a letter from the Western Association's Committee on Ministry granting approval of ordination for Pastor Cobb. An ordination celebration will be planned after the first of the year. This has been a long process for Pastor Cobb and we congratulate and thank him for his patience during this time. We look forward to celebrating!

Pastor Cobb reported on activities he performed in August, 2020: 4 worship services California; 4 worship services Salem; 1 fair vesper service; 10 DVD deliveries; 26 days at office; 2 prayer cells; 1 UCC of California consistory meeting; 4 recordings Time of Hope; 5 office visits; 1 Sunday school meeting; 1 stewardship meeting; 1 funeral (Jane Inglish); 1 wedding/rehearsal (Christine Koestner & Kevin Huffman); 1 youth sponsor meeting; 1 high school youth Sunday sermon prep meeting; 1 confirmation follow-up meeting (Layne Brandes); 4 signing birthday cards; 1 Ministerial Alliance meeting; 1 pre-marital counseling; 20 home/work visits; 1 UCC Committee on Ministry ZOOM meeting; 1 VBS mini camp; 1 KRLL morning devotion; 1 recorded Facebook video for congregation. In August was able to do more home visits and visiting families that are considering membership. Still working on the new website, making adjustments and corrections. As Vice-President of the Ministerial Alliance have assumed the responsibility for those meetings during the current absence of the president.

In old business, the COVID-19 guidelines were reviewed and adjusted. Plans for October are to reopen the nursery; remove signs related to COVID; remove tables in the downstairs foyer and return the bench and chairs; place Bibles in the back of the sanctuary for those who wish to use them; ask acolytes to light candles. Other guidelines will remain in place – social distancing and recommendation to wear masks when up and when singing.

In new business, the Financial Review Committee is being formed, wedding policies were discussed, cleaning kits have been placed in meeting rooms, kitchen and other high use areas and the next Communion date is World Communion Sunday, October 4, 2020. Prepackaged communion cups will be available.

### Special Benevolence— October

### The Salvation Army of Jefferson City, Missouri

The benevolence offering for the month of October is the Salvation Army Center of Hope. The Center of Hope is an emergency shelter for homeless men, women, and parents with children. It is the only shelter in the Jefferson City area that accommodates and can house all these groups, including veterans and senior citizens.

The Center of Hope Emergency Shelter provides social services that include a food pantry, clothing vouchers for the Salvation Army Thrift Store, Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners, Christmas assistance for food and toys for families, Christmas and Easter gifts for nursing home residents. Additional services available to help the homeless or near-homeless are the Pathway for Hope Program, rent and utility assistance and a permanent housing program. There are services specifically for children, such as free scouting programs, summer camps, kids choir and Christmas Kids.

The Salvation Army Corps provides Sunday School for all ages on Sunday at 10:00 a.m. and regular worship service on Sunday at 11:00 a.m. Please prayerfully consider giving to this worthy Christian cause.



**Devotion** – The meeting began with a time of devotion by Russell Cobb, based on the Day 18 devotion in the booklet, <u>31 Days of Prayer for My Nation</u>, entitled "Pray for Revival Among God's People".

**Business Meeting** — Abe called the meeting to order. The minutes of the February 2020 meeting were read and approved. The treasurer's report included a current balance of \$2569.71 following a recent donation of \$210 to the Moniteau County Ministries Center. Following a brief discussion, the group voted to send a donation of \$1,000 to Rob and Lynne Branham of the Australian Christian Mission. The Branham's had presented a program at the Brotherhood's February meeting. The group discussed whether or not to have a fish fry in October, but dropped the idea for now. Meeting adjourned.

**Program** – Larry Rohrbach introduced Darrell Hendrickson from the Moniteau County Health Center for the evening's program. He noted that Darrell previously served as Chief Regulator for Nursing Homes for the State of Missouri. Darrell gave an overview of the coronavirus in Moniteau County since March and talked about the progression of the virus and how the county health staffers have provided guidance and monitoring activities along the way. There are currently 53 active cases in Moniteau County. Darrell pointed out that our positive cases have been on the rise due to people getting out and about more, schools in session, etc. Moniteau county's positivity rate remains higher than many others, but surrounding counties have seen a significant rise in cases also. (Positivity rate = no. of positive results/no of tests given) Darrell mentioned that improved testing with immediate results would be very helpful in doing a better job controlling the virus. He also noted that two people in the county that contracted the virus with symptoms in March have symptomatic positives again in September. Still, the best way to avoid contracting and spreading the virus are social distancing, wearing masks when distancing is difficult, washing hands and practicing good general hygiene.
