Of course, you can catch our services online and we encourage you to do so, but when you worship in new places on vacation, you show your family that worship is important. ### Old Business:

# Women's Guild – May 19, 2021

Pamela Hill, Vice President, called to order the May 19th meeting of the Women's Guild with 13 women present.

Carole Barbour led our Bible Study on miracles of Jesus. Before studying our first miracle we reviewed the disease leprosy—incurable by man, very painful ulcerations with a foul discharge, weakening illness, resulting in death. First miracle studied was Jesus healing the man with leprosy as noted Mark 1:40-45, where the man approached Jesus in or near a rural (non-walled) city and asked Jesus if you are willing you can make me clean. Jesus reached out his hand and touched him saying, "I am willing. Be clean!" Immediately the leprosy left the man and he was cured. The second miracle studied was the healing of the Gentile Centurion's Paralyzed Servant as noted in Matthew 8:5-13. The Centurion had faith that if Jesus would only speak a word his servant would be healed. Jesus was amazed with the man's faith and said, "Go, let it be done for you as you have believed." And his servant was healed at that hour. In closing, the group discussed what makes an occurrence a "miracle". At the June meeting we will be reviewing: 1) healing of paralytic man lowered from roof, 2) healing of man's withered hand on the Sabbath, 3) raising of widow's son from the dead in Nain, and 4) calming of a storm on the sea.

Pamela Hill shared two Thoughts for the Day: First sharing a poem noting that God is always with us and a poem by Pat Boone noting his love (and our love) is with conditions and that only God gives love unconditionally. Mrs. Hill also reminded the group that our Benevolent offering for May would go to Rape and Abuse Crisis Center. And that the church's benevolent offering was Strengthen the Church and the Sunday School benevolent giving was the Healing House. Our offering was taken.

Pamela Hill called to order the business meeting and the following actions were made: approval of minutes from April meeting, approval of financial report, reminder that Committee #1 serves the next Celebration of Life meal, collected over 2,000 Best Choice labels to date, and signed 24 cards for members not able to attend worship. # UCC Brotherhood Minutes - May 24, 2021

**Refreshments** – The UCC Brotherhood began its meeting at 7:00 p.m. enjoying a light supper and delicious desserts provided by Steven Burger.

**Devotion** – Pastor Cobb led the group in prayer, followed by singing of an inspirational hymn. Abe Rohrbach then shared a brief devotion about dealing with life's challenges and obstacles. He used the story of Abe Lincoln's life as an example of how persistence, patience and faith in God can help one cope with difficulties and failures as we go through life here on Earth.

Business Meeting – Abe called the meeting to order with approximately fifteen members and guests present. The minutes of the April meeting were read and approved. Under old business, Steven Burger noted that he would have the devotion at the regular July meeting instead of June as originally planned. A motion was approved for the Brotherhood to make a \$500 donation to the Show-Me Christian Youth Home in La Monte, MO. Under new business, the Brotherhood has been asked to provide special music for the July 4 church service. The group agreed to do so and will practice at the June meeting. Dale Ratcliff shared that the program for our June meeting will be an Amish gentleman sharing the story of the Amish people and their history. Meeting was adjourned.

**Program** – Larry introduced Sarah Walsh, State Representative and Majority Caucus Chairman in the Missouri Legislature to discuss highlights of the recent legislative session. Representative Walsh mentioned several of her priorities that were successful from the session, including additional funding for the Northern Boone County Disaster Relief Team, funding for the new Renken Technical School being built in Southern Boone County, a bill outlawing the use of laser pointers against law enforcement personnel, a bill allowing forensic examiners and crime scene examiners to use flashing lights to assist in reaching crime scenes in a timely manner, as well as a resolution encouraging our federal legislators to keep the Supreme Court at its current size of nine justices.

She then discussed several of the broader issues that were debated during the legislature this session including the gas tax increase, taxes on on-line purchasing, the prescription monitoring program, the 2<sup>nd</sup> amendment preservation act, and the use of covid vaccine passports for travel, etc.
