

California United Church of Christ October 13, 2021 – Consistory Meeting Highlights

The California UCC Consistory met for its regular monthly meeting November 8, 2021. Pastor Cobb opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes of the October 2021 meeting, Treasurer's Report, Financial Secretary's Report, Stewardship Snapshot and Local Benevolence Report were reviewed and approved.

Reports and updates were given by committees and organizations: Evangelism planning a float in the Christmas California Style Parade and looking into new CUCC T-shirts. Historical committee is working with Brian Stahl to get a shelf for bust made and secured. Memorial-nothing new to report. Building and Grounds- Light bulbs in sanctuary changed to LEDs. Looking into a solution for the track system above choir loft (structural and fixture issues). Received communication from Rehagen on Boiler-they will have a specialist come and review, the current system was pieced together which adds some complexity for replacement. Additional bids requested but no additional communication returned. Bid was returned for cleaning of Sanctuary Carpet (\$775), Pew Cushions (\$440), Classroom Walkway (\$235) and folding chairs (\$4/chair). Motion approved for Cleaning of Sanctuary Carpet and Pew Cushions after the winter season. Bid received for Restrooms under Sanctuary (off Fellowship Hall). Both restrooms \$9350, replaces flooring and sub floor where rotting has occurred, replaces fixtures and plumbing issues. Snow removal contract approved from Buekers, awaiting contract from Gene Haile. Irrigation system is winterized. Bids requested for exterior work/aesthetic Safe Church- Fire Marshal Inspection reported need to improvements. replace batteries on elevator, replacement in process. Cleaning supplies were picked up from Sam's for month of giving, located in hallway between entry and Fellowship Hall. Replaced 4 Communion Cup holders in pews. Worship- Advent season planning underway, 35 Poinsettias ordered. Stewardship- nothing new to report, meeting Nov 23rd. Brotherhood and Women's Guild continue with monthly meetings. Sunday school planning Christmas Eve Program. Additional discussion led to the decision to only have in person worship on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day, no streaming. This will allow everyone to fully participate in the services and reflect on the Christmas Holiday. Youth Group has Operation Christmas Child underway, live nativity planned, Wed evening meal will be done by the Youth Group on Dec 1st, Taco night!



The Women's Guild met on November 17, 2021, in the Fellowship Hall with 14 ladies present. President Linda Schnieders called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m. Carole Barbour led our Bible Study on Jesus' Miracles. The Bible verse for our first miracle is John 9:1-12 – Jesus healing the blind man with mud. The second miracle studied is Mark 9:14-29 – Jesus healing a boy with an unclean spirit. The third miracle studied is Matthew 17:24-27 – Jesus sends Peter to fish for the temple tax. The fourth miracle studied is Luke 11:14-23 – Jesus driving the mute demon out of a man. We determined the remaining miracles 26 through 29 would be studied in January and February of 2022.

Mary Burger shared the Thought for the Day, a poem on Thanksgiving.

The mission we support for November is CWS – Blanket Fund. The Church's benevolence is the Buddy Pack program, and the Sunday School's is the Rape and Abuse Crisis Service. We are encouraged to support these benevolence offerings.

The offering was received.

Business Meeting—Carole Barbour made the motion, and Phyllis Miller seconded the motion to approve the October 20, 2021, minutes with a correction that the Women's Guild benevolent offering was Operation Shoe Box, not Healing House and New Beginnings. Motion unanimously approved.

Our financial report for October 5, 2021, to November 5, 2021, was reviewed. Phyllis Miller made the motion to approve the financial report, and Carole Barbour seconded the motion. Motion unanimously approved.

Committee #2 served the Celebration of Life dinner for the family of Doug Cantriel. Reed Millard paid for dinner from Steve's Family Restaurant, and approximately 75 people attended. The remaining dinners were taken to our Church's shut-in members by the family. Committee #1 served the Celebration of Life dinner for Eulah Gertz, and approximately 24 people attended. Committee #2 will serve the next Celebration of Life dinner.

The Card Ministry sent out 28 cards last month, and we signed 36 Christmas cards today. The cards will be available to sign after the worship service this Sunday.

We received a Thank You note from Ruth Brizendine for our efforts in hosting her family for the Eula Gertz Celebration of Life dinner. **Old Business**—The Community Thanksgiving meal contributions by the Guild need to be delivered to the California Nutrition Center. The hams need to be there this Friday, November 19, and the pies and other supplies need to be delivered on November 23 and 24th.

We discussed the Christmas Gift plans for our nursing home church members. We will each bring ten snack bags of two cookies each for our gift bags to our next meeting on December 15, 2021. As a reminder, our December meeting will be at noon for our Christmas luncheon.

We will host the Confirmation Reception after the Lenten service on April 6, 2022. We discussed possible 2022 Bible study ideas, and we will continue the last of Jesus' Miracles in January and February 2022. Carole Barbour is researching the possibility of a study of Lamentations using a Presbyterian Women's study workbook.

New Business—We discussed Christmas gifts for the church staff and agreed on \$50 cash for the same staff as last year.

The Nominating Committee presented the slate of officers for the 2022 to 2023 term. President - Pamela Ives Hill and Vice-President - Linda Schnieders. The slate of officers was unanimously approved. Mary Lee Brizendine submitted her resignation as Secretary, and Clarice Nelson has graciously agreed to complete her remaining term ending December 2022. Our thoughts and prayers are with Mary Lee.

Clarice Nelson made the motion to continue the same benevolent projects for 2022 as in 2021, and Judy Burger seconded the motion. It was unanimously approved.

Linda Schnieders handed out membership updates that we completed and turned in to her.

The Guild member birthdays this month are: Harriet Bryant – November 12 and Carla Clennin – November 13. We shared our Joys and Concerns.

Linda Schnieders gave the closing prayer. Phyllis Miller and Barbara Weis served delicious refreshments, and we had a time of fellowship.
