

Messy Church

“I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another in what you say and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly united in mind and thought.” I Corinthians 1:10

No church is perfect. We've all seen many churches struggle at various times. I've seen it up close and personal at different times in my life. Many times those situations cause division and hurt feelings that take years to heal if they ever do heal. In the two letters to the Corinthian church, we see the Apostle Paul deal with many issues that were dividing that church. California United Church of Christ December 13, 2021 – Consistory Meeting Highlights

The California UCC Consistory met for its regular monthly meeting December 13, 2021. Pastor Cobb opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes of the November 2021 meeting, Treasurer's Report, Financial Secretary's Report, Stewardship Snapshot and Local Benevolence Report were reviewed and approved.

Reports and updates were given by committees and organizations: Evangelism-time did not allow activities for this December, but plans are made for next year, committee looking into new CUCC T-shirts early 2022. Historical committee reported Brian Stahl did not charge for the shelf, consistory will send a thank you on behalf of the church. Memorial-nothing new to report. Building and Grounds-Carpet in upstairs expected to get installed in Dec. Concrete work outside still to come. New lights up in the gym. Heater for gym approved in congregational meeting, timeline expected to be installed in the next 2 weeks. Recommendation is to use the second system through the summer but plan to replace before another heating season is needed to avoid the same issue as we currently have. Andy Burger installed a new dimmer with new lights in sanctuary, it did not work. After some research Andy ordered another dimmer for sanctuary lights, hoping to be installed prior to Christmas. Elevator batteries replaced (to be used in case of a power outage) and per inspection criteria. Carpets steam cleaned. One bid received regarding boiler, now closer to \$40,000; another bid is expected soon but is also expected to come in higher. Safe Church-the semi-annual walk through is next month (January 2022). Worship reported Advent programing, with families reading, has been positively reviewed by several members of the church. Special music for winter has been filled. Poinsettias will be filling the sanctuary soon. Next meeting will cover Lent and Easter. Stewardship committee planned Rock Solid Financial Planning workshop scheduled for January and an E-giving workshop to be given 2 times a year during Sunday school, a possible video uploaded to our website as well, look for more to come. Next meeting on Jan 18th.

Brotherhood and Women's Guild continue with monthly meetings. Sunday school had a good meeting and continues to discuss ways to meet all our members, including young, middle and high school ages and adults, input and volunteers are welcome. Youth Group Taco Night went well, thank you for your continued support, Youth will serve the meal for the annual meeting.

Note of 2021 Snapshot regarding C. Schnuck Endowment Checking: *The C. Schnuck Endowment Checking Fund balance of \$25,846.04 includes \$1,166.49 that is part of the original restricted gift and is unable to be expended. \$24,679.55 of the fund balance may be expended.*

For several years, the last Sunday in January has been designated as Gideon Sunday and all loose plate offering has been sent to the Gideon Ministry. Over 100 years ago, three men formed an organization whose only aim was to provide Bibles to be placed in hotel rooms. Since that beginning, millions of new and old testaments and other religious tracts have been distributed to men, women, children, hotels, motels, doctors' offices, prisons, army personnel, colleges, schools, and other groups. Many people have had their first encounter with Jesus Christ through a Bible or testament handed to them by a Gideon or Auxiliary member. Gideon members are nominated for membership by the local Gideon camp and approved by their local pastor and they pledge to help distribute God's word whenever and wherever they can through the world. More than 175 countries in the world have Gideon camps with thousands of members helping to spread God's message every day.


