The California UCC Consistory met for its regular monthly meeting June 13, 2022. Pastor Cobb opened the meeting with prayer.

The minutes of the May 2022 meeting, Treasurer's Report, Financial Secretary's Report, Stewardship Snapshot and Local Benevolence Report were reviewed and approved.

Reports and updates were given by committees and organizations. Evangelism continues working on t-shirt designs and updating the float banner. Evangelism also sponsored a new member luncheon and Mother's Day. Worship Committee, Memorial, and Schnuck Endowment have nothing to report. Stewardship has a meeting scheduled for July.

Building and Grounds updates-

Front doors have been installed and stained, waiting on the handles to be corrected. We have the invoice but will hold it until everything is correct.

Andy reported he has signed quotes for exterior work and boiler based on Congregation Meeting and they have been turned in. Boiler parts are being ordered and work will be scheduled.

We have requested updated quotes for ACs.

Andy replaced the microwave and will remove the old one.

Lights over island in fellowship hall have been reported as needing to replace.

Floor Tile Replacement: Awaiting moisture test.

Gym Rooftop unit, heater to be replaced this summer per plan.

Brotherhood and Women's Guild continue to meet with good discussions and studies. Women's Guild helping with desserts and organization of Renee's Retirement Reception. Sunday School continues with "The Story" this summer. Youth Group is planning activities for the summer.

Consistory Highlights—Continued

Old Business:

Salary Committee to meet one-on-one with each employee to establish a review process for each position, list expectations and allow time for feedback. Then meet as a committee for recommendations regarding a more formal evaluation and salary review each year. The committee would then speak with each employee with results of recommendations prior to official approval and updating.

New Business:

Non-Member Funeral Policy will mirror the Non-member wedding policy and, when updated, will be shared with each local funeral home. Laura Burger will get the policy and share at the July meeting for approval. Wedding Policy will also be reviewed, specifically the current rate charged.

Offering for Ukraine and/or tornado relief taken on Pentecost Sunday.

We have reviewed the building use request policy, the current policy states “no group or person may use the facility for financial gain”. After discussion, the consistory agreed with the current policy and will enforce going forward. During this same discussion, due to the cost of utilities and operation of the building, a motion was made and carried stating: As of July 1, 2022 a suggested donation of \$10/practice for teams who utilize the gym be made, regardless of membership status.

Giving Envelopes-UPDATE- We thought we had paid for 2023, however, that was for 2022 (they bill late.) After discussion, committee decided to order 120 boxes of envelopes. If you currently receive envelopes and do not want to keep receiving them, please let Renée or a consistory member know.

Special Benevolence—July

RAPE & ABUSE CRISIS SERVICE (RACS)

The special benevolent mission project for July is the Rape and Abuse Crisis Service (RACS). RACS is a non-shelter, social service agency providing crisis intervention, advocacy, support and education/prevention services to victims/survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence and stalking. **RACS** began its mission in early 1980 by establishing a 24-hour crisis hotline to offer emotional support and referral information to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. Nine central Missouri counties are served by RACS including Cole, Gasconade, Maries, Miller, Moniteau, Morgan, Osage, Southern Boone and Southern Callaway. The agency continues to evaluate the services provided in order to more effectively address victims' needs. Services have gradually expanded as needs and funding for this not-for-profit agency have increased. The services they provide are free of charge to people who have been victims. They also provide education and prevention programs to end personal violence in our society. Providing victims with the opportunity to regain confidence, control and direction in their lives helps keep this community strong. Please give to the important mission in the attached envelope.

UCC Brotherhood Minutes – Monday, June 27, 2022

Refreshments – The meeting opened at 7:00 p.m. with delicious refreshments provided by David and Cressida Gattermeir.

Business Meeting – The meeting was called to order at 7:30 by Abe Rohrbach. The minutes from the May meeting were read and approved. Abe read several thank you notes and mentioned several items of correspondence asking for monetary donations. Reverend Cobb then read a letter from Reverend Andrew Lovins to the Brotherhood. Reverend Lovins is working with a project called The Shield Church that helps people struggling with mental health and dependency issues. The Brotherhood will follow the project for consideration and support. The treasurer's report was approved with a current balance of \$1,300.17. Rob Barbour volunteered to provide refreshments for the July meeting. Meeting adjourned at 7:55 p.m.

Devotion – Larry Schoeneberg presented a devotion based on the hymn, Work for the Night is Coming, and on the Biblical reference John 9:4, "As long as it is day, we must do the works of him who sent me. Night is coming, when no one can work." The hymn is based on a poem written by an 18 year old woman named Annie Walker in 1854 and later put to music as a hymn by Lowell Mason. Larry noted that the words of the hymn reflect on our work in the morning or youth of our lives, our work in the noontime or middle of our lives, and our work in the dusk or twilight of our lives. The devotion concluded with the singing of the hymn and a prayer.

Program – Reverend Cobb started the program with a synopsis of the work of the California Ministerial Alliance. He then introduced Alan Bailey, minister of First Christian Church and Thomas Medlin, minister of New Beginnings Church. Rev. Bailey described a new Summer Food Service program that will provide lunch for kids age 1-18 on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday from July 5 through August 11 in the fellowship hall of First Christian Church. Rev. Medlin then shared information about The Well CaliMo, a non-profit that provides basic needs to anyone in the community. Some of the projects of the Well include Diaper Days, Summer Food Service, Adult Diapers, specific needs for school children and emergency supplies for folks in crisis. He asked people to help with prayer, resources and volunteer help. Rev. Cobb then summarized by mentioning some of the most critical needs provided by the ministerial alliance.

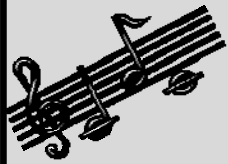

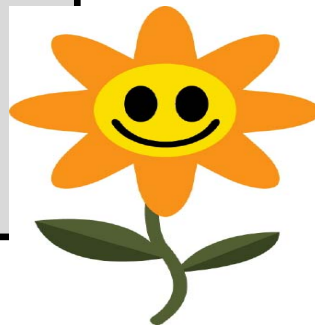
