The July meeting of the Consistory was Called to Order at 6:00 pm by President Laura Burger. Laura opened the meeting with prayer.

A quorum was established with all members present--Ellen Ash, Carole Barbour, Jay Bestgen, Laura Burger, Alan Chambers, VanDee Miller, Ronnie Kissick, and Larry Schoeneberg.

The Minutes, the Treasurer's Report, Financial Secretary's Report, and Stewardship Snapshot were approved.

Facility Use Agreements were approved.

Committee Reports

Building and Grounds/ Safe Church: Jay Bestgen and Ronnie Kissick

--<u>Handicap Door Timer</u>: After much effort, Ronnie Kissick determined that the timer can only be reprogrammed by a representative from Brady Glass. The plan is for that to happen when Brady Glass comes to make an estimate on repair of the east windows in the sanctuary.

--<u>Landscaping Committee Update</u>: (Committee members: Laura Burger, Judy Burger, and Christine Huffman) Laura reported that the layout of the beds will remain the same. Some plants have been purchased and plans made to complete the project.

--<u>The Entry Foyer Project on both sides of the sanctuary has been completed!!!</u> Rugs have been ordered. Linda Schnieders will make curtains for the coat room entries in both foyers.

--<u>The gate at the top of the steps</u> leading down into the Fellowship Hall has been reinstalled as per regulations for the Playschool to operate in the 2023-2024 school year.

--<u>Imhoff Painting and Brady Glass will again combine efforts on the windows</u> on the Oak Street (east) side of the church. Imhoff's estimated cost for painting was \$6,500.00. The Brady Glass estimate for frames and covering was \$35,500.00. At a Congregational Meeting on August 6, 2023, the Consistory will ask for approval to spend up to \$42, 000.00 for painting and covering of the Oak Street windows.

--Jay Bestgen gathered facts from conversations with the security firm SWC and put them together in an accurate and understandable way. At the August 6, 2023 Congregational meeting, information on the SWC Security Proposal to protect our building and personnel will be presented. There will be another Congregational Meeting on August 27 focusing on the Security Proposal.

Historical: Norman Rohrbach, Chair

-The Historical Committee has placed pictures and information of Active Members of the Military in the Cabinet by the church office. Moniteau Christian Ministries Center



Moniteau Christian Ministries Center was formed to provide a permanent location for Project Share which had been operating out of a rented storefront since May 1, 2003 and the Food Pantry which was a once monthly mobile pantry operating at various locations in California. The MCMC building is located at 303 Latham Road. We welcome anyone who has not seen the Thrift Shop (open Thursday, Friday, & Saturday from 10 am to 2 pm) to stop by to see the many and varied items for sale.

The Cargill Cares Food Pantry began operating at this location in April 2014. It is open from 3-5 pm on the first, second, and third Thursday & Friday of each month and from 9-11 am on the third Saturday. Food items distributed are received from the Central Missouri Food Bank, local donations, food drives, & other supporting entities. If anyone is needing food, please come to the food bank on distribution days. The Cargill Cares Food Pantry serves an average of 215 families each month.

Participating Moniteau County schools pick up their Buddy Packs monthly during the school year at Cargill Cares Food Pantry.

Project Share's Thrift Shop provides free clothing monthly to those requesting clothing assistance. Project Share's income provides monies to the food bank, pays utilities, insurance and numerous other expenses to maintain the MCMC facility.

A benevolent activity that Project Share has undertaken is a prison ministry where an inmate may request needed items (1-pant, 1-shirt, & 1-coat). Hopefully items will be available off the racks.

Project Share is also in need of volunteers to prepare the donated clothing, etc. to stock their thrift store. This activity takes place every Monday & Tuesday from 10 am until around 2 pm or as many hours as you wish to help.

Moniteau Christian Ministry is most grateful for all the support the United Church of Christ has given. Also, very glad we have a food pantry and thrift shop in our own community! WE ARE BLESSED!

UCC Brotherhood Minutes – Monday, July 24, 2023

Refreshments – A delicious meal and desserts were provided by Dave Meyer to begin the meeting. A blessing was provided by Steven Burger.

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 PM with 20 members and guests present. The meeting was started with a hymn "Take Thou our Minds Dear Lord." Norman Rohrbach gave a devotion on Matthew 5:37 "All you need to say is simply Yes or No, anything beyond that comes from the evil one" and James 5:12 "Above all, my brothers and sisters, do not swear, either by heaven or by earth, but let your "yes" mean "yes" and your "no" mean "no" so that you won't fall under judgement," remarking that, although many of us fall short, we should all make every effort to curtail our use of bad language, even "substitute" curse words and that we should strive to be different and more Christ-like in this way.

Business Meeting – The business meeting was called to order at 7:48 PM. Minutes from the June 26 meeting were read and approved.

Treasurer Tony Barry gave the Treasurer's report. The offering from the June meeting was \$112.00 and a gift of \$1520 was received from the memorial of Richard Meisenheimer (\$100 additional has been received since the June 26 meeting), which brings the current account balance to \$3368.35.

Details of Brotherhood-sponsored fish fries were discussed. The first will be held on August 3 for Vacation Bible School participants. Frying will begin at 4:00 PM with dinner at 6:00 PM. The second fish fry will be held in lieu of the regular Brotherhood meeting on August 28 at 6:30 PM. Members are asked to bring a side dish. The Men's Brotherhood from Central Church in Jefferson City will be invited to join. Other activities discussed included a sing along and brief introductions from attendees.

A \$200 donation to the Moniteau County SB 40 Board was proposed and approved.

Discussion was continued regarding the Brotherhood's participation in the inmate program. The program will be held during the week of September 18. President Dave Meyer has been in discussion with Mike Staton, who has lined up transportation for the inmates. Meals will be provided during the week by the Brotherhood, the UCC California Women's Guild, the California Methodist and Christian Churches, and the City of California. Lanny Ash volunteered to work with the city to coordinate meals that have been provided by the city in previous years, and Rob Barbour and Larry Rohrbach volunteered to help coordinate side dishes and condiments. The First Christian Church has volunteered to conduct the Sunday service for the inmates in 2024.

Program – State Representative Willard Haley, whose legislative district includes all of Moniteau County, spoke on his background and recent legislative business in the Missouri House of Representatives.

Representative Haley is originally from Pilot Grove, where he grew up on a farm, and expressed appreciation for how he was raised. He attended Mizzou, and started work after graduation in Agriculture Education at Eldon High School. He worked 32 years in the school system in Eldon and as Director of the Tri-County Technical School. After retirement, he served in a variety of church (he attends the Methodist Church in Eldon) and civic organizations.

He was originally approached to run for the Missouri House of Representatives by former representative David Wood and made the decision to run in 2019 after extensive prayer. His district originally encompassed parts of Moniteau County, but was redrawn after the 2020 census to include the county in its entirety. Since his election, he has voted on a number of important bills, including:

- * Support for tax credits for farms
- * Opposition to new gasoline taxes
- Opposition to charter schools and open enrollment because of their potential to be detrimental to local schools, particularly smaller school systems
- * Support for preventing biologically male trans students from participating in girl's athletics
- * Support for banning the use of gender-altering treatments by minors
- Support for locking in property tax rates for senior citizens, although important clarifications do need to be made to the legislation to make it consistently applicable

The meeting was adjourned at 8:55 PM.


