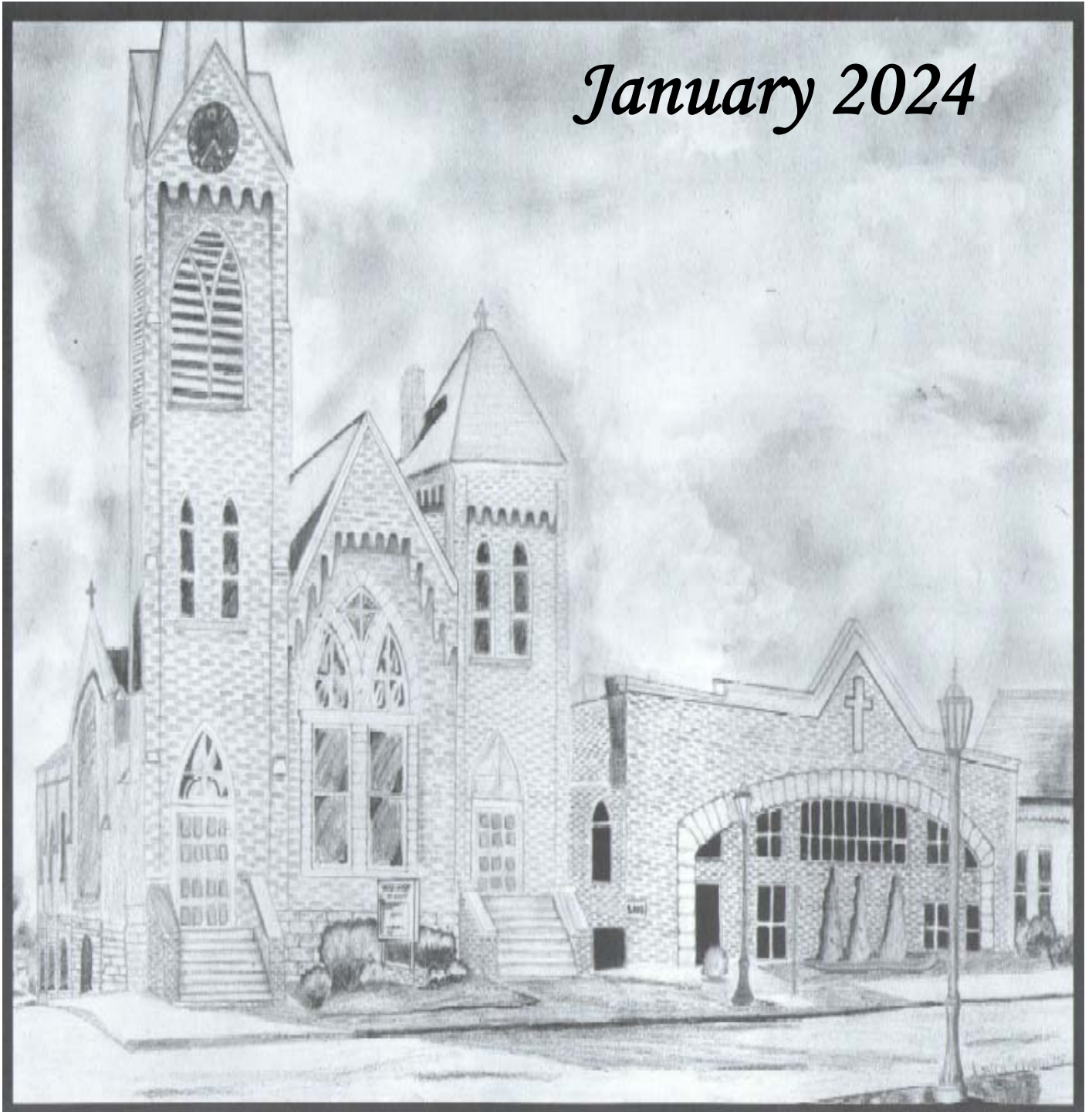

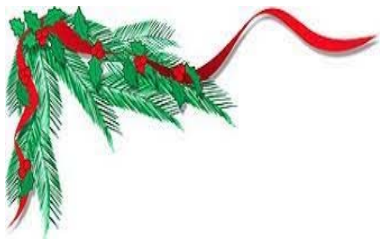

Elevator: Maintenance Control Program/Reservoir Leakage

The Elevator Inspector and Elevator Tester arrived together. They each have a rate of \$250.00 per hour with a 2 hour minimum. Findings:

1. A valve needs to be replaced. Jay will order and replace it.
2. A sign should be posted on the elevator shaft saying "No Head Clearance"
3. The pump reservoir is leaking. Repair efforts will be made as replacement is expensive and complicated.

Dimmable Gym Light Project (Ronnie) Supplier still looking for lights that will fit our space

Outside Light on Cross-White light to shine on cross.

Bid from Ted Bueker (Trim trees/Remove Dead tree)- Men from the Brotherhood will trim the tree by the west side of the parking lot and remove the trimmings.

Pastor's Report-Lent begins February 14, 2024 (Ash Wednesday) and Easter is March 31, 2024. Reverend Cobb has been approached by the Christian Church minister about having a Lenten service at their church. The service at the Christian Church would not be an Ash Wednesday or Maundy Thursday service and would include Confirmands helping with the service, but no Statement of Faith. The Consistory approved of the idea.

Office Door Unlocked on Sunday Mornings: There was a request by some of the Sunday School teachers that the office door remain unlocked on Sunday mornings so that the teachers could access the copier etc. The door will remain locked, but teachers can request a key that allows Office access.

Chamber of Commerce Dues- California UCC will join the Chamber of Commerce for 2024 at a cost of \$40.00.

Gideon members are nominated for membership by the local Gideon camp and approved by their local pastor and they pledge to help distribute God's word whenever and wherever they can through the world. More than 175 countries in the world have Gideon camps with thousands of members helping to spread God's message every day.

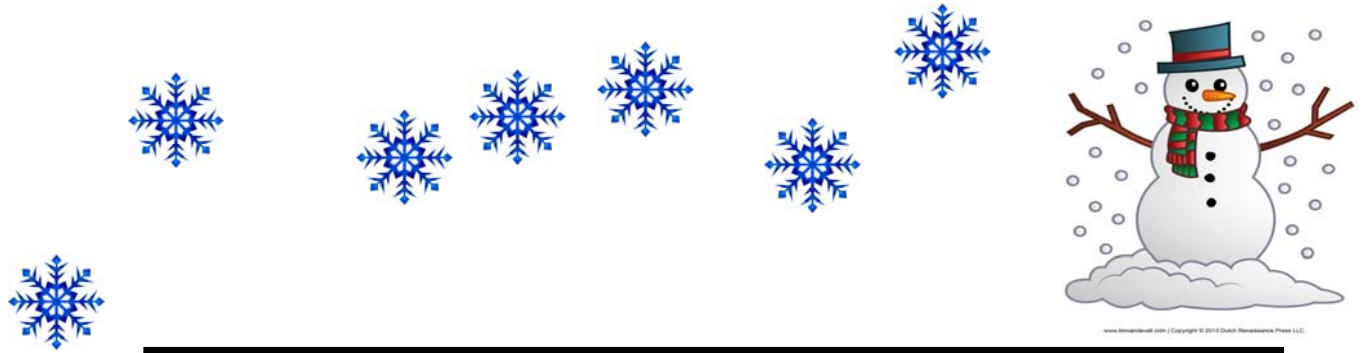
