California United Church of Christ May 13, 2024 – Consistory Meeting Highlights

Consistory President Alan Chambers called the meeting to order at 6:04 p.m. and Reverend Cobb opened the meeting with prayer.

A quorum was established with Ellen Ash, Carole Barbour, Jay Bestgen, Holly Bieri, Alan Chambers, Jim Deeken, VanDee Miller, and Larry Schoeneberg present.

The Minutes of the April meeting were approved along with the Treasurer's Report presented by Ellen Ash, The Financial Secretary's Report (including the Statement of Financial Position and comparison of income and expenses for 2022-2024) prepared by and presented by Larry Schoeneberg, and the Stewardship Snapshot

Larry noted that a CD from the Undesignated Bequests had matured on May 10, 2024. The monies will be reinvested in another CD for a term of 1 year.

Worship Statistics were reviewed. There has been a slight increase in attendance at Sunday morning worship when comparing the numbers from 2022, 2023, and 2024. Jay Bestgen said that he would be interested in seeing the online statistics for Sunday Morning Service viewing somehow included. That raised the question of how is a "view" defined.

Building Use requests were approved.

Committee Reports

Building and Grounds - Jay Bestgen and Jim Deeken

- Oak and North Street window covers Imhoff Painting has completed painting around the windows and the covers can be installed as weather allows.
- Elevator Valve/Head Space Sign The valve is being custom made and has been ordered, but there is no definite delivery date. In the final report there was no mention of the sign advising "No Headroom", it did say that a phone is needed in the elevator.

Light Switches in Sound Room off of the Gym--a work in progress

- Gas Stove Clips (to keep burners from being turned on by accident) A cover is being made.
- Carpet for office-The plan is to move the things out of the office on May 29, paint the office on the 30th have the carpet laid on the 31st, and move back in on June 1st. The smaller office is not yet scheduled. The temporary office will be in the Meeting Room.

Church Mutual--insurance update- A Church Mutual representative toured the facility. There is still no definite word on whether the current coverage is adequate. There was general discussion about deductibles, areas of coverage (wind, fire, earthquake etc.), and what effect if any the new security system and new window coverings could have on the policy premium.

SWC (new security system)- SWC has provided training on how to use the new system. There is a pre-arranged schedule for when the doors will always be unlocked (Sunday mornings, Wednesday evenings etc.) As part of the testing process, some key fobs are being used now for entry when the doors are locked. If the door is locked, the doorbell may be rung and during office hours, one can be buzzed in. Cameras are currently activated. There will be articles in the Sunday morning Worship bulletin and in the Tidings when all is ready.

UPDATE – Building Access & Cameras

We are nearing the full implementation of the building access and camera project. Currently, we are testing the system and distributing access "fobs" (electronic key) to any member that may want one. Contact the Church office if you want your personal access. This change will provide 24/7 access to the Church through the lower doors at the office by simply "swiping" your "fob" at the scanner and the door will unlock and then lock behind you.

For many of you, there won't be any noticeable change as we will have the lower doors opened for planned activities like Church service, Sunday School, Wednesday night meals, Church programs, weddings and other events. If you don't want or have a "fob" and want in the church during business hours, there will be a "call button" to be let in by the office staff.

We have a Church that is fortunate to be very active, a popular gathering place and provides full-time staff and volunteers to make everything work. The change will provide staff in the building (sometimes only a single person is present) with security in their daily work. Consistory members will have off-site (from their homes) means to check on the church during non-business hours. We will know if doors are or have been left open and we will be able to check on the Church without physically being onsite. We will also be able to verify the students coming and going for Playschool during the school year which is a proactive approach.

We are planning to go live with the system on June 3rd, tentatively. The Consistory thanks you for your support, patience and adapting as we move forward.

• Members always look forward to Joys and Concerns. We always have an opportunity to lend a sympathetic ear, to unburden our cares, and to learn how to be a good friend.


Carla C. gave an update on happenings in the Conference and concerns related to finding a conference minister in 2025.





Carmen attended school there through the eighth grade. Her family then moved to a town that had a high school and Carmen graduated there. She went to college in Puerto Rico and completed a B.S. degree in Psychology. She worked in a child care facility for a while. She then moved to Chicago to attend McCormick Seminary. While there she met and became friends with a fellow student, Dick Ferris. She and Dick both graduated from the seminary and launched a life of ministry and social work. They served churches in Savannah and Jamestown, Missouri for a number of years, with Dick being the minister and Carmen supporting his work as well as working in child services employment. While in Missouri, they established a family with four boys, Danny, Paul and Arthur Ferris and Randy Ennis. While serving St. Paul's church in Jamestown, they bought 10 acres from Chester Marshall and built a house, doing most of the work themselves. They later moved to Ohio and worked several years before retiring. After Dick passed away from health problems, Carmen moved back to California, Missouri in 2020 to a home next to her son, Randy Ennis. She has been a very active member of our church and Sunday School serving in numerous ways.
