## **Daniel's Visions of the Future**

*“Multitudes who sleep in the dust of the earth will awake; some to everlasting life, others to shame and everlasting contempt. Those who are wise will shine like the brightness of the heavens, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars for ever and ever.” (Daniel 12:2-3)*

We will finish up the intriguing book of Daniel in the month of June. The first half of the book contains very familiar stories while the last half contain all the visions that Daniel had about the future and the end of times. Daniel is called the book of Revelation of the Old Testament. The last chapter of Daniel sounds a lot like chapter 20 of the book of Revelation and they were written hundreds of years apart. Daniel shows that the Bible is consistent from beginning until end. The Bible can be trusted and it is our guidebook for life and for eternity.

The verses above are consistent with Jesus' words that eternity exists and that how you live your life for God or without God affects your eternal status. Without God, you will live eternally far away from God's presence in shame and torture. Those who live for God are called wise and they will shine like the stars in the universe because they led people to righteousness and to God's presence. Are you living a life of righteousness and wisdom, following God's commands and believing in Jesus? Jesus tells us the greatest commands are to love God first and love others second. Start out simply each day thanking God and telling him you love him. Then spend your days showing love to your family, your friends, and those you meet. Jesus called that letting our light shine.

One way we can lead others to righteousness and letting our light shine is helping at VBS or in Sunday School. Ronda Mortenson still needs a few helpers to complete her staff for VBS. I have challenged Ronda that if they can get 100 kids registered for VBS, they can do something special to me. They are coming up with a list of possible funs thing to do to me if they can reach 100 kids at VBS. Wouldn't that be awesome! We'll announce in a couple of weeks what we have agreed to. VBS is June 22-26 and you can register at the church website. Right now we have 40 kids registered.

Betty and I will be gone the week of June 9-13 on vacation. We will celebrate Father's Day on June 15<sup>th</sup>. We hope to have some of our high school youth do devotions in honor of their dads that Sunday. We continue to pray for our members going through different treatments and our members who are in care facilities. Another way to let our lights shine is to go visit or write those members and let them know you are praying for them.

## **May 12, 2025 – Consistory Meeting Highlights**

The May meeting of the United Church of Christ of California was called to order at 6:01pm by President Carole Barbour. Reverend Cobb opened the meeting with a prayer. A quorum was established with Carole Barbour, Jay Bestgen, Holly Bieri, Jim Deeken, Ellen Ash, Larry Schoeneberg, and Kris Ingram present. Anny Roll was absent.

Minutes of the April Meeting were approved along with the Treasurer's Report given by Ellen Ash and the Financial Secretary's Report and Stewardship Snapshot given by Larry Schoeneberg. In the check detail one check was noted: Check #1039 to Dyan Ingram in the amount of \$331.96 (from the Youth Fellowship Fund) for reimbursement of expenses from the Women's Conference. In the Carmen Schnuck Endowment account a \$100,000 CD with Ally Bank matured on March 20, 2025 and was reinvested in Bankwell Bank for 12 months at a rate of 4.15%.

Correspondence included a thank you note from Ava Motley and a letter of resignation from Letha Peck in her role as cook for the Wednesday Evening Meals.

### **Committee Reports**

#### **Building and Grounds/Safe Church – Jay Bestgen, Jim Deeken, and Kris Ingram**

An analysis bid for the Lower Entrance Roof Project was received from Septagon in the amount of approximately \$175,000. Jay Bestgen and Jim Deeken will schedule another meeting with Septagon to get a break down of the analysis bid. Brady's Glass has started work on the Stain Glass Window Restoration Project. Rob Barbour volunteered to re-paint the stripes in the parking lot. The church will provide the materials needed for the project.

#### **Youth Group – Kris Ingram**

Starting May 28<sup>th</sup> and going through the summer the Youth Group will have weekly Bible Study get togethers at the Ingram's home.

## **Old Business**

The Personnel Policy was modified and updated.

Easter Breakfast – A total of \$391.07 (approximately \$2.44 per person) was spent this year. Many donations were received including eggs, ham, plates, napkins, and table coverings.

## **New Business**

Sound Booth – a couple of additional volunteers have come forward to assist with the sound booth. A rotational schedule will be implemented soon.

Mother's Day Cookies – The reimbursement of \$216 for the Mother's Day Cookies was approved.

Graduation Gifts – Consisted of a devotional book, a leather bookmark, and a leather cover journal.

Scholarship Application Revisions – Jim Deeken presented the Consistory with a revised Application for the Edward Kaiser and United Church of Christ Scholarship along with a brief history of the scholarship. After learning the history of the scholarship discussion was had about updating the name of the scholarship to include the Sperber and Albertin families.

Wednesday Evening Meal Cook- A retirement gift for Letha Peck of \$100 was approved. The Consistory will begin the search for a new Wednesday Evening Meal Cook.

# Pentecost Sunday, June 8, 2025

## Communion

Pentecost Sunday is a significant day in Christianity that commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles and other followers of Jesus after his ascension. It's often referred to as the "birthday of the Church" as it marks the beginning of the public proclamation of the Christian gospel and the establishment of the Church community.

On Pentecost Sunday, people often wear red as a symbolic representation of the Holy Spirit's transformative power and the "fire" of God's love. Red is also used to signify the "tongues of fire" that appeared above the apostles on the first Pentecost.

The Bible verse commonly associated with Pentecost is Acts 2:1-4. This passage in the book of Acts describes the day the Holy Spirit was given to the apostles, who then began to speak in other languages.

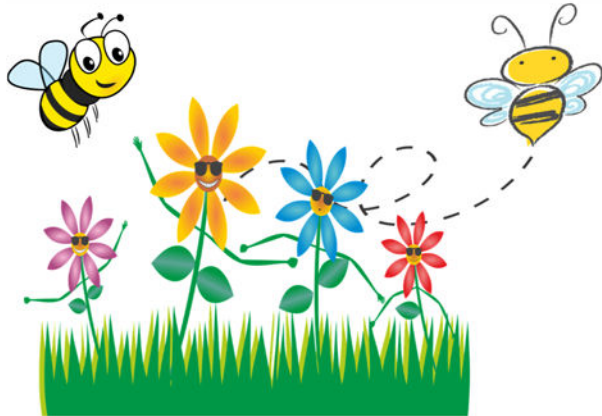
