California United Church of Christ August 11, 2025 – Consistory Meeting Highlights

The August meeting of the United Church of Christ of California was called to order at 6:10pm by Vice-President Jim Deeken. Reverend Cobb opened the meeting with a prayer. A quorum was established with Jim Deeken, Jay Bestgen, Holly Bieri, Anny Roll, and Larry Schoeneberg present. Carole Barbour, Kris Ingram, and Ellen Ash were absent.

The Treasurer's Report was given by Larry Schoeneberg. The balance brought forward in the General Fund was \$30,281.65. There were \$18,216.87 in receipts and \$22,071.24 in disbursements with a balance of \$26,427.28. There were no checks to note.

The Financial Secretary's Report was given by Larry Schoeneberg. It was noted that total income for the month of July was down 52.7% compared to July 2024. One of the notable changes in income between July 2025 and July 2024 was in the church offering. Church offering for July 2025 was \$14,766 compared to July 2024 offering of \$31,903. Larry Schoeneberg also gave an update on current CD activity. The UCC Church General Account (Umpqua Bank Roseburg, OR) has reached maturity and will be reinvested for 6 months.

The Stewardship Snapshot was presented.

Rev. Cobb reported that a check was written from the Local Benevolence account to reimburse an anonymous member for fixing the garage door of a member in need.

Committee Reports

<u>Building and Grounds/Safe Church – Jay Bestgen, Jim Deeken, and Kris Ingram</u>

Lower Entrance Roof Project – Jay expects to have option 2 from Septagon for the September meeting.

Stain Glass Window Project – Brady's Window and Glass has been working to fix the stain glass windows in need of repair as their schedule allows. This continues to be an ongoing project.

Revamping Fellowship Hall – The project has begun with the painting already complete and carpeting the walls well underway. This project should be completed by August 15th.

Deep Cleaning – Mint Professional Cleaning will begin a 2-phase deep cleaning project on August 28th. Mint Cleaning will strip and wax tile flooring, deep clean windows, vents, bathrooms, rubber stairs, and the four Sunday School Classrooms that sustained water damage last winter.

Old Business

Sound booth – No new volunteers have come forward, but the group seems to be working well with the new schedule.

Nursery Attendant – Anny Roll's daughter is interested in the position and will pick up an application as soon as possible.

New Business

Membership List – Consistory members reviewed the current membership list.

Middle School Youth Group - Connie Bestgen and Tammy Kilmer approached the Consistory about starting a youth group for the middle school youth children. They plan to have a parent meeting soon and would like to start the Middle School Youth Group off with a swimming party at the California Public Pool. Consistory members recommended that parent permission be given before any off campus events take place. Consistory members also agreed that it is a great idea to include the middle schoolers in their own youth activities and gave their blessing to Connie and Tammy.

Craig grew up in California and is a long-time member of UCC California, where his family still attends. He was inspired to join the military by the events of September 11, 2001 and began service in the Air Force when he graduated from high school in 2002. His service included tours of duty in Iraq in 2005 and Afghanistan in 2006, where he was a First Sergeant covering units at 4 bases across Afghanistan. From 2012 to 2015, he served as crew member for the Air Force Thunderbirds.

After retirement from the Air Force, he became involved with the Combat Veterans Motorcycle Association, which is dedicated to the support of combat veterans from all branches. He became commander of his chapter (Camdenton) in 2022. His chapter has raised more than \$50,000 to support veteran's causes and was instrumental in the repatriation of veteran's remains from overseas.






