



October 13, 2025 – Consistory Meeting Highlights

The October meeting of the United Church of Christ of California was called to order at 6:04pm and opened with thoughtful prayer by President Carole Barbour. A quorum was established with Jim Deeken, Jay Bestgen, Holly Bieri, Larry Schoeneberg, Carole Barbour, Ellen Ash, Anny Roll and Kris Ingram present.

Treasurer, Ellen Ash presented the Treasurer's Report and the Stewardship Snapshot Report. The balance brought forward in the General Fund was \$24,135.79. There were \$20,288.55 in receipts and \$32,038.93 in disbursements with a balance of \$12,385.41. Several checks were noted: Check #1190 to Taylor Hampton in the amount of \$2,100 for finishing painting Fellowship Hall, Check #1191 to Allrise Elevator Company in the amount of \$650 for an elevator inspection, Check #16817 to Rev. Mike Williams in the amount of \$70 for mileage reimbursement.

Financial Secretary, Larry Schoeneberg presented the Financial Secretary Report. The General Fund balance is substantially lower than normal, due to lower-than-normal donations and higher insurance and electricity costs. The Consistory voted to transfer \$25,000 from the Building Fund to the General Fund to address the low income balance we are currently experiencing.

Larry Schoeneberg also gave an update on current CD activity. The Lebeck Bequest – Undesignated matured on October 10th and will be reinvested. The UCC Church General Account will mature on October 23rd.

Committee Reports

Building and Grounds/Safe Church – Jay Bestgen, Jim Deeken, and Kris Ingram

Stain Glass Window Project – Brady's Window and Glass continues to work on the stain glass windows in need of repair and/or stabilization.

Fellowship Hall Sinks – The City Department will be contacted to see if they can run a camera down the drainage pipes to check for a blockage.

Deep Cleaning – Mint Professional Cleaning is finishing the floor waxing project and will begin cleaning the windows, deep cleaning the bathrooms, and cleaning the Sunday School Classroom which sustained water damage last winter.

Old Business

Nominating Committee – The Nominating Committee has begun communications and will begin filling open committee positions.

New Business

Christmas Decorating – The Consistory gave their blessing for the Brotherhood to decorate for Christmas again this year. The Brotherhood will plan to decorate on November 17th.

Salary Committee – Ellen Ash, Larry Schoeneberg and Carole Barbour will make up the Salary Committee and will meet in November.

Financial Review Committee – Ross Robertson and Callie Simmons will continue to serve on the Finance Committee and will begin their review.

Nonmember Wedding – The Consistory gave their blessing of approval for the nonmember wedding of Morgan Hineman and Hunter Hays on August 22, 2026.

Christmas in the Park – The group agreed that Christmas in the Park would be a wonderful chance to advertise for the church. Decorations will be up from November 29th until January 4th. If interested, the Evangelism Committee will coordinate that project.

Cressida led discussion on meeting days and times- the first Monday of the month at 6:30. Ronda motioned, Courtney seconded. Motion passed.


Giving Tree update- Cinda will ask Lisa to decorate at the same time as Brotherhood, 4th Monday in November. Should be ready by Sunday 11/30.

The Sharefest for the Central Region was held Saturday, October 18th at the Tipton United Methodist Church. The theme was “Give, Serve, Share.” Because of the generosity of our congregation, we were able to deliver the following:

9 Family Food Packs
10 Paper Product Packs
10 Personal Hygiene Packs
7000 Best Choice Labels
40 Backpacks of Love Quilts
25 Baby Quilts



All of the above stay in Missouri and their value was \$2,219.00.

Clarice Nelson made the beautiful 40 Backpacks of Love Quilts. A statistic worth noting is that Clarice has made 189 of these quilts the past 4 years and 171 have gone to the Sharefest. Awesome!

Judy Burger and her friends, Clarice Brown and Sharon, made the 25 Baby Quilts that were adorable. A special thanks to you both!

For those people who would rather make a donation, anything not specified, we put under, “Where Needed Most.” That amount this year was \$540.00. A donation of \$100.00 was designated for the Cambodia project. The amount for these two items was \$640.00 bringing the total cash and non-cash gifts to \$2,859.00. I also took a check for \$100 from the Women’s Guild for our September benevolence, but it is not included in this report.

The Festival of Sharing 2025 online Quilt Auction is Sunday, November 2nd beginning at 10 a.m. and ends November 8th at 10 a.m. The funds raised go to the Church World Service Blanket program. For more information go to www.festivalofsharing.org/quilts.

Missouri Mid-South Conference Update

The Missouri Mid-South Conference Annual Gathering (CAG) was held in-person or virtually on Saturday, October 18 with the theme “Where Do We Go from Here”. Prior to CAG was a Town Hall meeting on the Budget (10/7), delegates and clergy could attend via zoom. There were 55 churches and 83 delegates and clergy attending, per by-laws meeting has a quorum. Larry Rohrbach and I attended as delegates from our church.

Call to order was held at 9:54 AM, Consent agenda, Business meeting agenda, standing rules, and Received reports were all accepted. Approval was given for CAG 10/19/24 and Special Meeting minutes 1/11/25 were approved as submitted. Slate of Board of Directors for 2025-2026 was approved, with a secretary to be presented when the Board meets.

Rev. Dr. Dane Sommer gave a report from the Personnel Committee as Rev. Monty Jackson was not present. Due to the CAG meeting on 1/11/25 voting down Rev. Mary Nelson as new Conference Minister, the personnel committee has spent most of the year reviewing documents and meeting with Diane Weible, Conference Minister Search Coordinator – Office of General Minister and President. Kathey Rainey has stepped down as Operation Manager for the MMSC, Leigh Porter has been hired as Operation Manager, she will be working mostly for MMSC and 10 hours a week for Eden Seminary. Youth Minister position was terminated after General Synod 2025.

Search process next steps will be to organize, educate, and review by-laws following the MMSC CAG. This means the Board needs to determine the definitions of the types of conference ministers. **Bridge minister** – Board contracted 3-6 month term; providing support during a transition period. **Intentional Interim minister** – Serves for a specific, agreed-upon period of time, usually 1-2 years, depending on the seriousness of the issues the congregation is facing. Interims receive training that focuses on guiding congregations through a wide variety of transitions. May not be considered for the Settle Minister position. **Settled minister** – called from search committee and enters into a Covenant with the Conference, length of service for a longer period of time. **Standing minister** – Must have standing the MMS then installed as MMS Conference Minister. Eligibility for conference minister cannot be a Bridge or Intentional Interim Minister. **Residency** – Conference Minister is preferred to live within the Conference.

Core Ministry Team reports were presented from Creating Community (also on website) No committee reports given for Empowering Congregations, Pursuing Justice and Equity and Visioning the Future During this session it was recommended a Disaster Preparedness Response team be created it would be great to get at least one person from each Council groups (Western, Eastern and St. Louis)

Sonya Vann gave a presentation on the new KPVF Radio Ministry. As a reminder the AM waves will only reach 10-miles from the house location. Hoping to launch June of 2026, streaming 12 hours a day; streaming the station would be Spring 2026 as streaming is easier to launch. KPVF is in need of donations to keep the station going, if you would like to donate go to <https://missourimidsouth.org/donate> go to Friends of the Conference and click on give now to add your donation.

Budget for 2026 – Approval was given for the Board to access up to \$100,000 from reserves in emergency vote was Yes 67; No 2 Abstained 0 Approval of the proposed 2026 budget with a deficit vote Yes 65; No 3; Abstained 1 to review the budget pages go to <https://missourimidsouth.org/wp-content/uploads/2025/10/updated-visuals.pdf>

Rev. Mary Nelson gave her Conference Minister report. She thanked everyone for the 4 ½ years she has been the interim minister. Her last day will be December 31, 2025, unless she accepts a position prior to that date. A farewell reception will be Saturday, December 13 at Eden more details to following.




