

California United Church of Christ

November 10, 2025 – Consistory Meeting High



The November meeting of the United Church of Christ of California was called to order at 6:03 p.m. and opened with thoughtful prayer by President Carole Barbour. A quorum was established with Jim Deeken, Jay Bestgen, Holly Bieri, Larry Schoeneberg, Carole Barbour, Ellen Ash, Anny Roll and Kris Ingram present. Reverend Lina Eddy was also present for the meeting.

Treasurer, Ellen Ash presented the Treasurer's Report and the Stewardship Snapshot Report. The balance brought forward in the General Fund was \$12,385.41. There were \$47,012.99 in receipts (which included a \$25,000 transfer from the Building Fund) and \$27,338.86 in disbursements leaving a balance of \$32,059.54. There was one check written Check #1194 written to Mint Professional Cleaning in the amount of \$1,558 for the deep cleaning they did of the church.

Financial Secretary, Larry Schoeneberg presented the Financial Secretary Report. Income year-to-date for 2025 was \$201,245.02 compared to income year-to-date for 2024 which was \$235,380.57. A noticeable change in income has been a decrease of \$28,924.69 in the Church Offering income year-to-date between 2025 and 2024. Year-to-date expenses for 2025 are currently \$247,824.79 compared to the year-to-date for 2024 of \$225,744.70. A noticeable change in expenses has been an increase in Insurance for 2025.

Larry Schoeneberg also gave an update on current CD activity. Undesignated matured and was reinvested with Wells Fargo Bank at a rate of 3.8%. The Undesignated Bequests Fund also matured after 9 months with Columbia Bank at a rate of 3.9%.

Worship Stats for October were printed and provided in notebooks for review. The monthly average for October 2025 was 162 with 92 online views, which was up from the previous two years.

Rev. Lina Eddy let the Consistory know that she plans to act as the supply minister during the months of November and December (except for December 28th which will be covered by Rev. Mike Williams). Rev. Eddy will not be available during the month of January and part of February. She will return for Ash Wednesday at which time she plans to enter a 6-month Covenant with the church. Once the 6 months are up there will be an option for a 3-month extension to the Covenant.

Committee Reports

Building and Grounds/Safe Church – Jay Bestgen, Jim Deeken, and Kris Ingram

Stain Glass Window Project – Brady's Window and Glass continues to work on restoration of the stain glass windows on the south side of the church.

Fellowship Hall Sinks – The sink drains in Fellowship Hall were cleaned, jetted, and a camera was used to help detect the issue with the drainage of the sinks. It was determined that there is a blockage in the drain somewhere under the parking lot (about 40' from the back wall). The plan moving forward will be to get a bid on a project that will involve cutting into the pavement of the parking lot to locate the Fellowship Hall drain and tying that drain into the main drain from the Friendship Hall to alleviate the drainage problems.



Evangelism – Anny Roll

The Evangelism Committee was seeking permission to participate in the 5th Annual Chamber of Commerce Cookie Crawl on December 6th from 9am to 1pm. They plan to hand out cookies and have a poster informing visitors of events at the church. The Consistory gave their blessing for the event.

The Evangelism Committee will be putting together a display for Christmas in the Park. They plan to have a candy cane path leading to a cross with a banner which say Jesus is the reason for the season along with the church's information. The Consistory approved the purchase of a banner for the display.

Old Business

Sound Booth- We are still looking for more volunteers. Jess Medlin still plans to be trained for the Sound Booth. Kris Ingram has also volunteered to be trained. Kris Ingram has taken charge of coordinating the sound booth schedule.

Nominating Committee Updates – The Nominating Committee has been working at filling the open committee positions. They still need to fill one Consistory position, one Evangelism position, and one position on the Carmen Schnuck Endowment committee.

New Business

Youth Fund – There was thoughtful discussion about providing the newly reorganized Middle School Youth Group with monetary funds. It was approved to split the youth fund as of January 1st, 2025. One youth group checking account will remain with two separate funds held, one for the Middle School Youth Group and one for the Senior High Youth Group.

Cradle Roll – The Consistory reviewed the current policy, and several recommendations were made. Parties who wish to have their child(ren) placed on the cradle roll should contact the front office.

Webpage & Facebook Page – These pages are currently being updated and in the future a technology committee may be needed to keep them up to date.

Memory Tree – The Brotherhood will put up the memory tree this year when they put up the rest of the Christmas decorations.

Greeters – Holly Bieri will take care of coordinating greeters for the months of December, January, and February. After that time, the Worship Committee will coordinate monthly greeters.

Totenfest will be held November 23rd.

Trash Service – The City of California has made some changes to their trash service. It was approved to request an additional trash cart for the church.








Special Benevolence—December



November 3, 2025 Sunday School Teachers & Offi

Cressida called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM. Those present were Cressida Gattermeier, Ronda Mortenson, Lauren Lawson, Beth Chambers, Austin Chambers, Dyan Ingram, Carole Barbour, Peggy Liebi, Steven Burger and Brittney Medlin. Cressida began with a prayer.

Cressida led a discussion of the October minutes. Discussion was held over Right Now Media-: usage, price, and ways to have it advertised for the congregation. It is estimated that it has been used 17 hours thus far, which costs approximately \$1500 annually. Cressida asked to approve the minutes. Ronda motioned to approve the minutes. Lauren seconded the motion. Motion passed.



New Business:

Cressida asked about special envelopes for Christmas Eve program/service offering. Do we take the offering all month or just for Christmas Eve? 2 weeks before Christmas Eve, and night of for the special offering in the bulletin. These funds go towards children's programming.

Treasury Report- Cressida's \$200 has not come out yet. We purchased VBS supplies early (instead of in January) due to them being on sale and purchased from other churches. Motion to approve by Steven Burger. Carole seconded it. Motion passed.



Benevolence is the Rape and Abuse Crisis Center in Jefferson City.

Ronda discussed Sunday ROK. This will be Sunday 11/9. The kids will make a prayer and thankful jar. Verses will be pulled out on a day when they are happy, afraid, thankful, sad, or loved. 120 strips will be in the jar matched to the emotion. When they are feeling a certain way, they select the correlating color and read the verse. The Bible study focus will be Jeremiah 1- the special gifts. If time allows, they will play a game called roll the turkey- use a dice and m&m's to make a turkey- when finished they say gobble gobble. It was decided there will be no grade limit for ROK. VBS theme will be "Egypt," 3 tents will be needed to build the city and will be changed throughout the week. December 6 is Veggie Tales- The Best Christmas Ever. Santa will come at 9:30. On the agenda is making Santa and Rudolph stick puppets, snacks, and games. The December Sunday ROK study will be the birth of Christ/Happy Birthday, Jesus theme. More information to come later.



Old Business:

Christmas Program update- Christmas letters. All participants have run through their parts except one. Participants are learning the songs on Wednesday during Gods Singers. Older kids still need to practice the songs. Austin mentioned having the younger children sing a song before the program. Sunday School teachers will practice in class and Santa and Mrs. Claus will lead the song during the program.

Austin gave an update on the Fall Party. There were around 60-70 in attendance. A fun time was had by all. An alternate location was suggested for next year- park, Ingram Acres, Country Club, Sweet Water were all suggested.

Giving Tree update- Cinda is heading this. The tree will be ready by 11/30.

Cookies and Carols update- sign-up sheet is needed. Ronda will put up a sign up after Thanksgiving on the bulletin board- 2 dozen per each (about 6 signups available). Add to the bulletin when it's closer. The date is 12/21 No classes will be held. Santa and Mrs. Claus will be there.

Dyan is inviting the congregation on December 7 to pack for Toys for Tots immediately after church at Sweet Chipotle. Santa will get pizza. 12/13 is distribution 8-3. A donation box will be placed in the lobby. The Youth Group Mission Trip is in July, they are going to Minnesota where they will be staying at a large camp with many other churches to worship, eat, and build and renovate (construction) together. They've raised about \$4-5,000.

The MSYF is wanting to do a breakfast fundraiser on either Dec. 7 or 14 to raise funds to participate in Young Christians weekend. The time would be 8:30-10 AM. After a discussion, it was suggested 8-9:30 would be a better time.

Ronda asked about mailing advent calendars for the youth. It was decided that these would be distributed during Sunday School versus mailing them this year.

Dyan asked about honoring our Veterans during the 11/9 service. Cressida will email to ask about standing to be recognized.

Beth motioned to close. Dyan seconded. Motion passed. The meeting was adjourned at 7:30 PM.

The next meeting will be Monday December 1, 2025, at 6:30 PM.






Tradition Updated: First Tuesday Quilters Invite

For most of its history, our church hosted a very active ecumenical Quilters group. Those ladies provided a traditional quilting service to members and the community, using the funds generated for benevolence projects. They also created and donated a quilt each year to the fall Festival of Sharing auction. The last four remaining members disbanded about ten years ago. (Maxine Bueker, Carole Bowlin, Betty Dummermuth, and Margaret Oesterly).

About thirty years ago employees in the California school system formed a quilting group. They were interested in learning the old skills and as well as modern machine quilting techniques. For the past eight years this evolving group (currently known as the First Tuesday Quilters) has been meeting at California United Church of Christ. Our purpose and methods have changed and expanded somewhat, but we retain the essence of those first quilters so long ago.

- Create a wide variety of useful textiles through needle and thread.
- Support, instruct, and inspire each other.
- Provide welcoming fellowship.

Promote friendship, service and love in our community.



Our individual creative efforts have ranged from purely personal items to charitable sewing, fundraiser items, quilts of valor, costumes for church productions, and items for Sharefest distribution.

We meet the first Tuesday of each month (except January and August) at California United Church of Christ from 11:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. On meeting dates, each person brings all the equipment and materials they need for their individual project. We set up work station tables in Friendship Hall and utilize the kitchen counters for cutting, pressing, or lay-outs. We have good lighting and plenty of space. Show and Tell is always a part of the day and everyone enjoys eating sack lunches together at 12:30.


