




Search Committee Update

December 8, 2025 – Consistory Meeting Highlights

The December meeting of the United Church of Christ of California was called to order at 6:02pm and opened with thoughtful prayer by Rev. Lina Eddy. A quorum was established with Jim Deeken, Jay Bestgen, Holly Bieri, Larry Schoeneberg, Carole Barbour, and Ellen Ash present. Anny Roll and Kris Ingram were absent. Reverend Lina Eddy was also present for the meeting.

Treasurer, Ellen Ash presented the Treasurer's Report and the Stewardship Snapshot Report. The balance brought forward in the General Fund was \$32,059.54. There were \$41,716.86 in receipts and \$40,281.37 in disbursements leaving a balance of \$33,495.03. There was one check noted: Check #16878 to Burgher Haus in the amount of \$1,200.00 for the food prepared for Pastor Cobb's farewell meal.

Financial Secretary, Larry Schoeneberg presented the Financial Secretary Report. Income year-to-date for 2025 was \$226,676.51 compared to income year-to-date for 2024 which was \$267,632.98. Expenses year-to-date for 2025 were \$272,128.38 compared to expenses year-to-date for 2024 which were \$252,133.02. Expenses have increased \$19,995.36 in the last year. Larry Schoeneberg informed the group that it takes approximately \$300,000 each year to operate the church.

Larry Schoeneberg also gave an update on current CD activity. The UCC Church General Account matured and was reinvested on November 12th with Bank of America, Charlotte, NC for 6 months at a rate of 3.7%.

Committee Reports

Building and Grounds/Safe Church – Jay Bestgen, Jim Deeken, and Kris Ingram

Stain Glass Window Project – Brady's Window and Glass was at the church on 12/8 working on the stain glass reinforcement and restoration project. Jay Bestgen met with Brady's Window and Glass about modifying the current scope of phase I. It was agreed that the best plan of action for the remainder of the windows in need of repair and stabilization will be to reinforce them in place instead of removing the windows completely as was previously planned. This new plan will save approximately \$23,000, will reduce the risk of damage to the already fragile windows, and will eliminate phase II.

The reinforcement of the stain glass windows on the south side of the church is almost complete. The windows in the bell tower and by the sound booth have been completed. The windows at the back of the sanctuary (along Oak Street) and the windows on the pulpit side of the church will be reinforced in the near future.

Fellowship Hall Sinks – After further investigation it was determined that the Fellowship Hall Kitchen drain line lies under the Ameren gas line. The next plan of action will be to tie the Fellowship Hall kitchen drain into the septic drain (gray water) lines from the basement in order to drain the kitchen sinks. This plan has been approved by the City of California.

Old Business

Sound Booth- We are still looking for more volunteers. Emma Kissick and Chole Mortenson have been training with Ronnie.

Webpage/Technology – The Nominating Committee will reach out to a couple of volunteers about serving on a newly appointed Technology/Communications Committee which will also include a Consistory representative. The newly appointed committee will be presented to the congregation at the annual meeting.

Greeter Schedule – Holly Bieri will plan to schedule greeters for January and February then the responsibility will be passed to the Worship Committee.

Exit Interview – Carole Barbour will find around 6 church members between California UCC and Salem to attend the exit interview meeting. Carole has the questions and will provide them to the attendees.

New Business

Mike Williams will preach on December 28th and January 25th. The Gideons will also speak to the congregation on January 25th.

We will need a minister for Epiphany communion on January 4th. Rev. Moll and Rev. Buchholz will be contacted about their availability on January 4th. The Consistory agreed to cancel communion on February 1st because an ordained minister will not be performing the service.

Gene Haile Excavating Estimate – The contract from Haile Excavating for snow removal and ice treatment was approved.

Quilters Tradition - Information about the Quilters group was provided from Clarice Nelson.

Salary Committee Recommendations & Staff Christmas Gifts – The Salary Committee provided the group with their recommendations for 2026 salaries and Christmas gifts for Staff and the recommendations were approved.

Annual Audit Committee – Ross Robertson and Larry Schoeneberg will complete the annual audit.

Annual Meeting Agenda – Annual Meeting Agenda items will include an update from the Search Committee and the newly created Technology/Communications Committee.

New Chair for Pastor's Office – A new chair will be purchased by Rhonda for the Pastor's Office.

Approve Calendar of Benevolences for 2026 – The 2026 Benevolences Calendar was reviewed and approved.

Chamber of Commerce – The 2026 Chamber of Commerce dues were approved.

For several years, the last Sunday in January has been designated as Gideon Sunday and all loose plate offering has been sent to the Gideon Ministry. Over 100 years ago, three men formed an organization whose only aim was to provide Bibles to be placed in hotel rooms. Since that beginning, millions of new and old testaments and other religious tracts have been distributed to men, women, children, hotels, motels, doctors' offices, prisons, army personnel, colleges, schools, and other groups. Many people have had their first encounter with Jesus Christ through a Bible or testament handed to them by a Gideon or Auxiliary member. Gideon members are nominated for membership by the local Gideon camp and approved by their local pastor and they pledge to help distribute God's word whenever and wherever they can through the world. More than 175 countries in the world have Gideon camps with thousands of members helping to spread God's message every day.

The next meeting will be Monday January 5, 2026, at 6:30 PM.



A motion was made by Laura and seconded by Phyllis to limit our food choices for 2026 to dessert and drink. Motion passed.


A social time was enjoyed by the group.
