April 13, 2026 – Consistory Meeting Highlights

The April Meeting of the California United Church of Christ was Called to Order at 6:06pm by President Jim Deeken. A quorum was established with Jay Bestgen, Jim Deeken, Larry Schoeneberg, Holly Bieri, Doug Dampf, Tara Mesienheimer, and Anny Roll present. Kris Ingram was absent. Rev. Lina Eddy opened the meeting with a thoughtful prayer.

Minutes from the March Meeting were approved. It was noted that with the stain glass window project being a third of the original bid and with ample donations for the project, the cost of the stain glass window project was covered.

Treasurer, Tara Meisenheimer presented the Treasurer's Report and the Stewardship Snapshot Report. The balance brought forward in the General Fund was \$62,371.26. There were \$47,550.90 in receipts and \$31,383.89 in disbursements leaving a balance of \$78,538.27. No checks were noted.

Financial Secretary, Larry Schoeneberg presented the Financial Secretary Report. The total income YTD was \$102,159.98 compared to the same time last year, which was \$76,404.17. The total expenses YTD was \$56,934.03 compared to the same time last year, which was \$82,643.78.

Larry Schoeneberg also gave an update on current CD activity. The Albertin Scholarship fund (\$21,000) matured and was reinvested with Bank of America Charlotte for 12 months at a rate of 3.75% with maturity on March 18, 2027. The UCC Church General Account fund (\$29,000) matured and was reinvested with Goldman Sachs New York for 9 months at a rate of 3.80% with maturity on December 17, 2026.

Gym Lights- New lights for the gym have been ordered. The new lights will be just as bright as the old lights but without the fans, making them much quieter. The cost of the new lights was around \$2,200 and the new lights come with a five-year warranty.

Memorial Committee – Jim Deeken

Ellen Ash and Stacey Friedrich are pricing a keyboard for the sanctuary.

Old Business

Church Membership – New Member classes will be held on April 26th, May 3rd and May 10th. Currently two individuals plan to attend the new member classes.

New Member Lunch – After discussing with the two individuals who plan to attend the new member classes it was agreed no new member lunch would be held at this time.

Easter Breakfast – Once again we had a wonderful Easter Breakfast with 140 people being served. A variety of items were donated for the breakfast including the ham, sausage, cinnamon rolls, doughnut toms, and eggs. After all of the donations the cost of the breakfast was \$210 making the cost per person \$1.50.

Cabinet Meeting – The Cabinet Meeting will be held April 26th.

The goal of this year's meeting is to brainstorm, explore and discuss the challenges our church is experiencing as we navigate our way through the pastor search.

New Business

Easter Cantata – It was agreed that an annual Easter Cantata should be considered for the 1st Sunday after Easter.

Approval of Scholarships – The Senior Scholarships were reviewed and approved by the group in the amount of \$500 each.

Senior Sunday – Senior Sunday will be held May 17th.

Wedding Policy – The Wedding Policy was reviewed and discussed by the group. It was agreed that the policy will be modified and revisited at a later date.

Funeral Policy – The Funeral Policy was reviewed and amended by the group to remove any facility charges for non-member funerals. Non-member funerals will still be approved by the preacher and the Consistory.

Floor Entrance - Jay Bestgen presented the group with a detailed drawing of the proposed flooring project with three different options. Option 1 is to replace the tile flooring at the back main entrance with epoxy flooring. The area covered for this option starts at the back entrance and goes towards the office window and up to the historical cabinet then through the double doors towards the gym around the water fountains and also through the double doors towards Fellowship Hall at the base of the staircase. This option would cost approximately \$9400 and would include removing the tile, grinding the concrete floor, placing the epoxy flooring and coating with sealer. Option 2 is to also replace the tile flooring down the hallway from the historical cabinet to the double door including the area outside the bathrooms. This option would cost approximately \$2800. Option 3 is to replace the tile flooring from the double doors down the hallway around the conference room and library and towards the side entrance door. This option would cost approximately \$2700. The bids for the flooring project were received from Dutcher's. The group discussed the different options and agreed to proceed with all three options. The flooring project will be scheduled after school is completed.

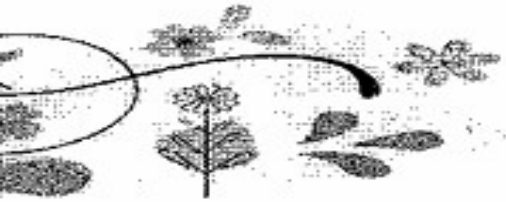
