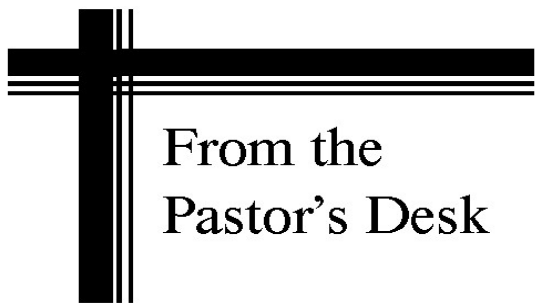

June 8, 2026 – Consistory Meeting Highlights

The June Meeting of the California United Church of Christ was called to order at 6:05 p.m. by President Jim Deeken. Pastor Matheny opened the meeting with prayer. A quorum was established with Jim Deeken, Jay Bestgen, Larry Schoeneberg, Kris Ingram, Tara Meisenheimer and Pastor Matheny present. Holly Bieri and Anny Roll were absent.

Minutes from the May meeting were approved.

Treasurer, Tara Meisenheimer presented the Treasurer's Report and the Stewardship Snapshot Report. The balance brought forward in the General Fund was \$82,800.64. There were \$21,739.88 in receipts and \$17,810.13 in disbursements leaving a balance of \$86,730.39. No checks were noted.

Financial Secretary, Larry Schoeneberg presented the Financial Secretary Report. The total income YTD was \$142,649.11 compared to the same time last year, which was \$108,089.24. The total expenses YTD was \$89,279.50 compared to the same time last year, which was \$128,196.17.

Larry Schoeneberg also gave an update on current CD activity. The UCC Church General Account CD was reinvested with a new maturity date of 12/17/2026. The Undesignated Bequests CD was reinvested with a new maturity date of 3/17/2027.

Committee Reports

Building and Grounds/Safe Church – Jay Bestgen/Doug Dampf/Kris Ingram

Water has been getting in through the gym windows. Kilmer's checked and repaired any windows needing repaired.

Kilmer's will also be checking the basement cellar door for potential repairs.

The other windows in the church will also be checked for potential leaks.

Korsmeyer Fire has submitted quotes for a fire alarm control box and wired sensors throughout the church.

The committee also met with Korsmeyer Fire to discuss the wireless system options, hardwire and heat sensors. Committee requested a bid for sensors and the monitoring fee. Options were discussed for the sanctuary and a bid was requested for that also.

Jim and Jay met with Tim Crawford to have his drafting company prepare potential improvement plans for a rain/weather cover at the back door. The board will wait for his submittal.

There is a new light on the fellowship hall door.

Jackson Bernard submitted a bid to wash all outside windows and inside gym windows.

Jay and Kris will be attending a Safe Church meeting in Versailles on June 10, 2026.

Brotherhood – Larry Schoeneberg

No May meeting was held. June's meeting will be held at First Christian Church due to VBS taking place at the same time. Pastor Matheny will give the program. The annual fish fry will be held on Thursday June 25, 2026 to conclude VBS.

RAPE & ABUSE CRISIS SERVICE (RACS)

The special benevolent mission project for July is the Rape and Abuse Crisis Service (RACS). RACS is a non-shelter, social service agency providing crisis intervention, advocacy, support and education/prevention services to victims/survivors of sexual assault, domestic violence and stalking. **RACS** began its mission in early 1980 by establishing a 24-hour crisis hotline to offer emotional support and referral information to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. Nine central Missouri counties are served by RACS including Cole, Gasconade, Maries, Miller, Moniteau, Morgan, Osage, Southern Boone and Southern Callaway. The agency continues to evaluate the services provided in order to more effectively address victims' needs. Services have gradually expanded as needs and funding for this not-for-profit agency have increased. The services they provide are free of charge to people who have been victims. They also provide education and prevention programs to end personal violence in our society. Providing victims with the opportunity to regain confidence, control and direction in their lives helps keep this community strong. Please give to the important mission in the attached envelope.

Program – Interim Pastor Mike Matheny spoke about his life experience leading him to California UCC. He lives by Galatians 6:9 “Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time, we will reap a benefit if we do not give up”.

He and his wife Donna have been married for 58 years and they have 2 children, a daughter who lives in Albuquerque, New Mexico and a son who is attending Medical School in Connecticut.

Pastor was born and spent much of his childhood in Oklahoma attending Methodist church, but attended high school and college in Springfield, Missouri.

After school, he moved to Wisconsin where he was the Associate Pastor at a Congregational church. His pastor there encouraged him to attend seminary and he attended Northern Baptist Seminary in Chicago. After seminary, he worked in Congregational churches in Wisconsin and Emporia, Kansas. He returned to Wisconsin, where he was a pastor in and around Milwaukee for 30 years, including being pastor of 2 UCC churches simultaneously (one in the city, one in the country). During this time, he also received his certification in Clinical Pastoral Education, which allowed him to be the Chaplain of a local children’s hospital, where his wife worked as a dental assistant.

After nearly 30 years, he semi-retired and served as an interim pastor in Pensacola, Florida and Cincinnati, Ohio. They most recently relocated to Albuquerque, New Mexico where his daughter and her husband reside. His son-in-law is also a pastor, and Pastor Matheny fills in there when needed.

He felt called to come to California as an interim pastor, and has been impressed by the warm and friendly reception they have received from the church and community. Pastor Matheny is an avid golfer, enjoys attending athletic events, and is a Green Bay Packers fan.

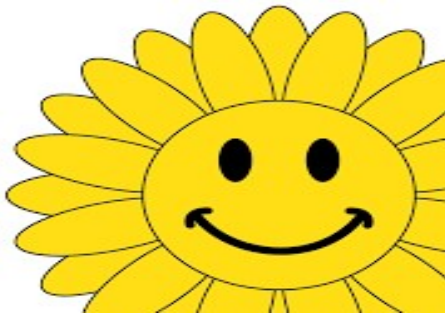

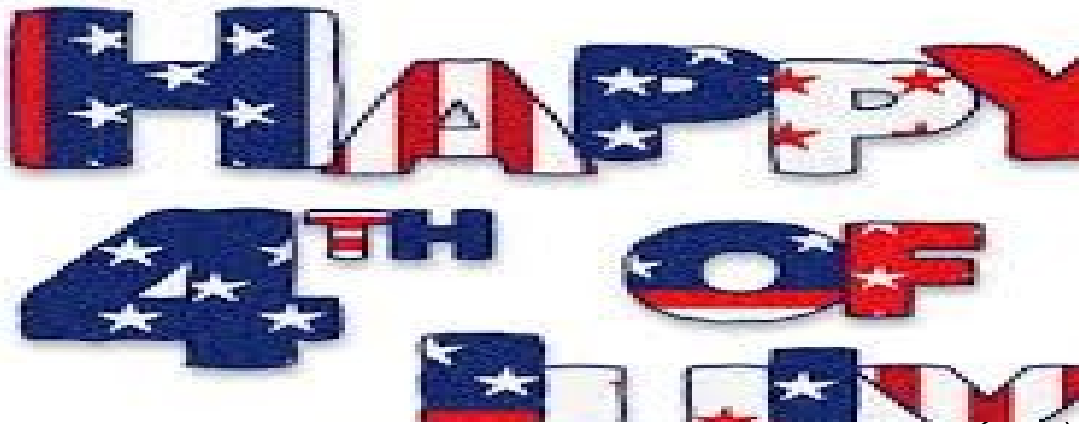
